

DSWD DROMIC Report #13 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon “Carina” as of 28 July 2024, 6PM


I. Situation Overview

On 25 July 2024, Super Typhoon “Carina” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,109,869** or **3,617,365 persons** are affected in **3,357 barangays** in Regions **NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **22,338 families** or **85,595 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **612 evacuation centers** in Regions **NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, VI, VII and CAR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **52,372 families** or **188,162 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **74,710 families** or **273,757 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, and CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **1,256 houses** were damaged; of which, **131** are **totally damaged** and **1,125** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, II, III, MIMAROPA, VI, VII, and CAR** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱271,468,569.62** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱218,713,037.68** from **DSWD** and **₱51,779,871.54** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱886,800.00** from **Non-Government Organizations** and **₱88,860.40** from **Other Partners** (see Annex H).
