## **DSWD DROMIC Report #14 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon “Carina”** as of 29 July 2024, 6AM

### **I. Situation Overview**

Since July 11, 2024, the Southwest Monsoon has brought moderate to heavy rains across various provinces in the Philippines. On July 18, a Low-Pressure Area developed over the Philippine Sea, followed by the formation of Tropical Depressions "BUTCHOY" and "CARINA" on July 19. The Southwest Monsoon, intensified by Tropical Depression "CARINA," caused moderate to heavy rains over western Luzon for three days. "CARINA" intensified into a Typhoon on July 22, and by July 24, it intensified into a Super Typhoon, making landfall in Northern Taiwan while moving northward away from the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

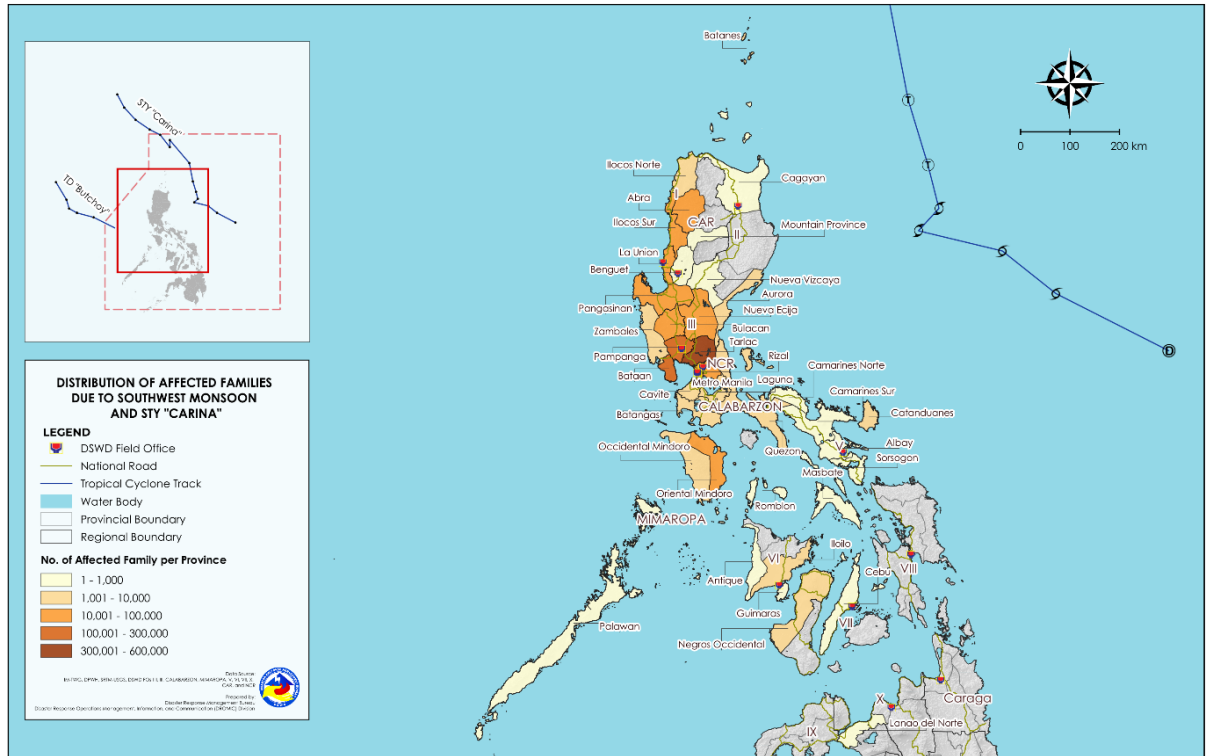
On 25 July 2024, Super Typhoon “Carina” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

The DSWD as the Vice-Chair for Disaster Response, promptly provided immediate assistance to families and individuals affected by the Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon Carina. The Department coordinates closely with LGUs, government agencies, NGOs, and humanitarian partners to ensure effective aid delivery, conducts assessments, and monitors ongoing needs to support affected populations and aid in recovery efforts.

### **II. Status of Affected Areas and Population**

A total of **1,118,031 families** or **3,639,961 persons** are affected in **3,581 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X, and CAR** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **15,933 families** or **62,305 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **418 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, VI, VII** and **CAR** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **49,429 families** or **176,611 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **65,362 families** or **238,916 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, and CAR** (see Annex F).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **1,892 houses** were damaged; of which, **168** are **totally damaged** and **1,724** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, II, III, MIMAROPA, VI, VII, and CAR** (see Annex G).

### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱302,449,884.52** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱228,646,400.51** from **DSWD** and **₱69,735,244.31** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱886,800.00** from **Non-Government Organizations** and **₱3,181,439.70** from **Other Partners** (see Annex H).
