

DSWD DROMIC Report #15 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon “Carina” as of 29 July 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

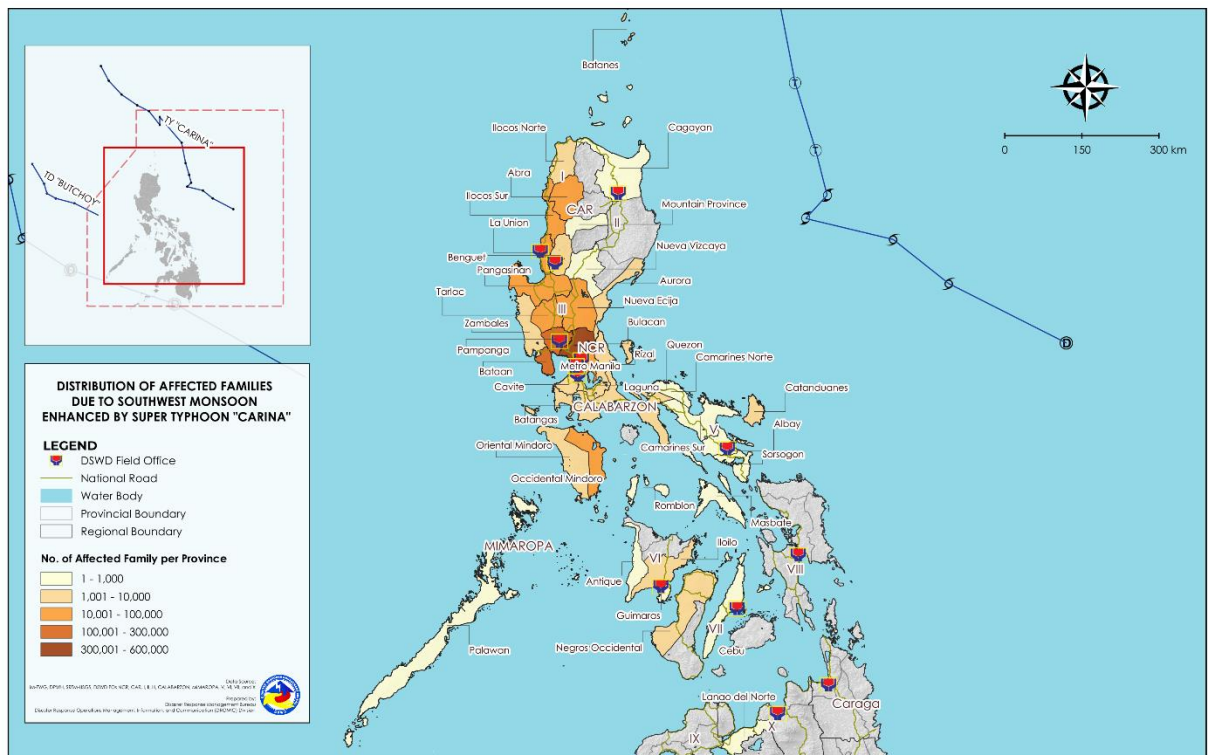
On 21 July 2024, the effects of Southwest Monsoon and “Carina” brought heavy rains in several municipalities in the country that resulted in the displaced of families and persons.

On 25 July 2024, Super Typhoon “Carina” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,123,932 families** or **3,662,851 persons** are affected in **3,616 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **13,995 families** or **53,691 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **382 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, VI, VII and CAR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **45,514 families** or **163,942 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **59,509 families** or **217,633 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, VI, VII, and CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **1,892 houses** were damaged; of which, **168** are **totally damaged** and **1,724** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X, and CAR** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱303,423,823.88** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱229,515,869.87** from **DSWD** and **₱69,922,914.31** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱803,600.00** from **Non-Government Organizations** and **₱3,181,439.70** from **Other Partners** (see Annex H).
