



DSWD DROMIC Report #17 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon

as of 26 July 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 12 July 2024 at 4:00 AM, the Southwest Monsoon may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains to the western sections of Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao

On the same day, heavy rainfall in Datu Montawal (Papagawan), Maguindanao del Sur caused the Pulangi / Rio Grande de Mindanao River to rise and consequently, resulted to flooding in some low-lying barangays. Sustained heavy rains also caused the Tual, Nalus, and Pangi Rivers to overflow and subsequently submerge several houses in Kiamba, Sarangani.

On 12 July 2024, several areas in Zamboanga Peninsula including Zamboanga City, Zamboanga del Sur and Zamboanga del Norte, experienced flooding due to continuous rainfall brought by the Southwest Monsoon.

Furthermore, extreme rainfall were also experienced in the flood-prone barangays in LGU of Kalilangan, Bukidnon resulting to flashflood in the area.

On 13 July 2024, Mandaue City and Santa Catalina, Negros Oriental, experienced flooding and landslide incident brought by the effects of Southwest Monsoon. Source: DOST-PAGASA Daily Weather Bulletin and DSWD Field Offices (FOS)


II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **170,074 families** or **833,341 persons** are affected in **388 barangays** in **Regions VII, IX, X, XII** and **BARMM** (see Annex A).









III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **13,962 families** or **66,177 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **39 evacuation centers** in **Regions IX, XII** and **BARMM** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **30,629 families** or **153,024 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **44,591 families** or **219,201 persons** displaced in **Regions VII, IX**, **XII** and **BARMM** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **133 houses** were damaged; of which, **77** are **totally damaged** and **56** are **partially damaged** in **Regions VII, IX, X** and **XII** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱45,763,314.40 worth of assistance was provided by to affected families composed of ₱45,178,314.40 from the DSWD and ₱585,000.00 from the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex H).
