

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Low Pressure Area as of 19 July 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

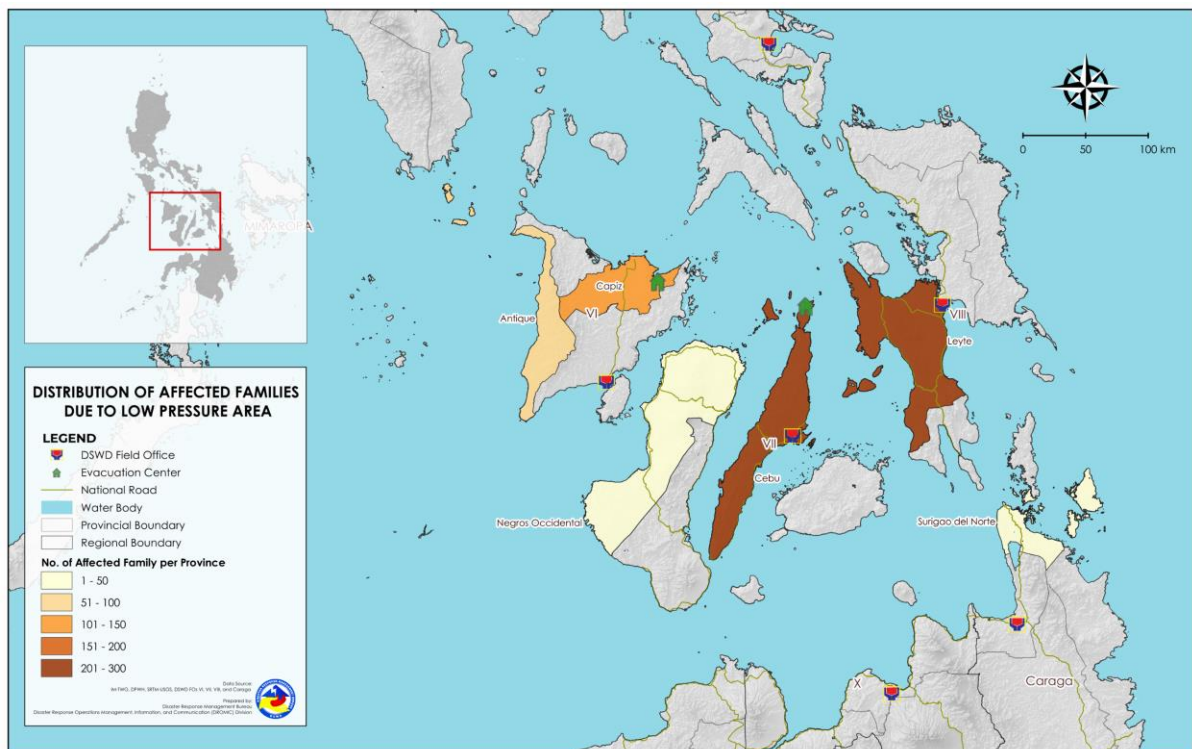
Issued on 19 July 2024 at 4:00 PM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 365 km west of Ambulong, Tanauan City, Batangas (14.2°N, 117.7°E).

Meanwhile, another LPA was estimated based on all available data at 865 km East of Eastern Visayas (12.8°N, 132.6°E).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **693 families** or **2,670 persons** are affected in **27 barangays** in **Regions VI, VII, VIII and Caraga**. (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **119 families** or **449 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **eight (8) evacuation centers** in **Regions VI and VII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **27 families** or **118 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **146 families** or **1,383 persons** displaced in **Regions VI and VII** (see Annex D).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱71,473.00** worth of assistance was provided by to the affected families composed of **₱22,600.00** from the **DSWD** and **₱48,873.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex E).
