





DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Low Pressure Area

as of 19 July 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview


Issued on 19 July 2024 at 4:00 PM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 365 km west of Ambulong, Tanauan City, Batangas (14.2°N, 117.7°E).

Meanwhile, another LPA was estimated based on all available data at 865 km East of Eastern Visayas (12.8°N, 132.6°E).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **693 families** or **2,670 persons** are affected in **27 barangays** in **Regions VI**, **VII**, **VIII and Caraga**. (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 119 families or 449 persons currently taking temporary shelter in eight (8) evacuation centers in Regions VI and VII (see Annex B).







b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **27 families** or **118 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are 146 families or 1,383 persons displaced in Regions VI and VII (see Annex D).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}71,473.00\$ worth of assistance was provided by to the affected families composed of \$\mathbb{P}22,600.00\$ from the \$\mathbb{D}SWD\$ and \$\mathbb{P}48,873.00\$ from the \$\mathbb{Local}\$ Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex E).
