
DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon “Carina” as of 23 July 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 23 July 2024 at 5:00AM, the center of Typhoon "Carina" was estimated based on all available data at 380 km East of Aparri, Cagayan (18.9 °N, 125.2 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 130 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 160 km/h moving North Northeastward slowly.

The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon "Carina" will bring moderate to intense rainfall over various localities in the western portion of Luzon tonight through Thursday.

In addition, the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon "Carina" will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

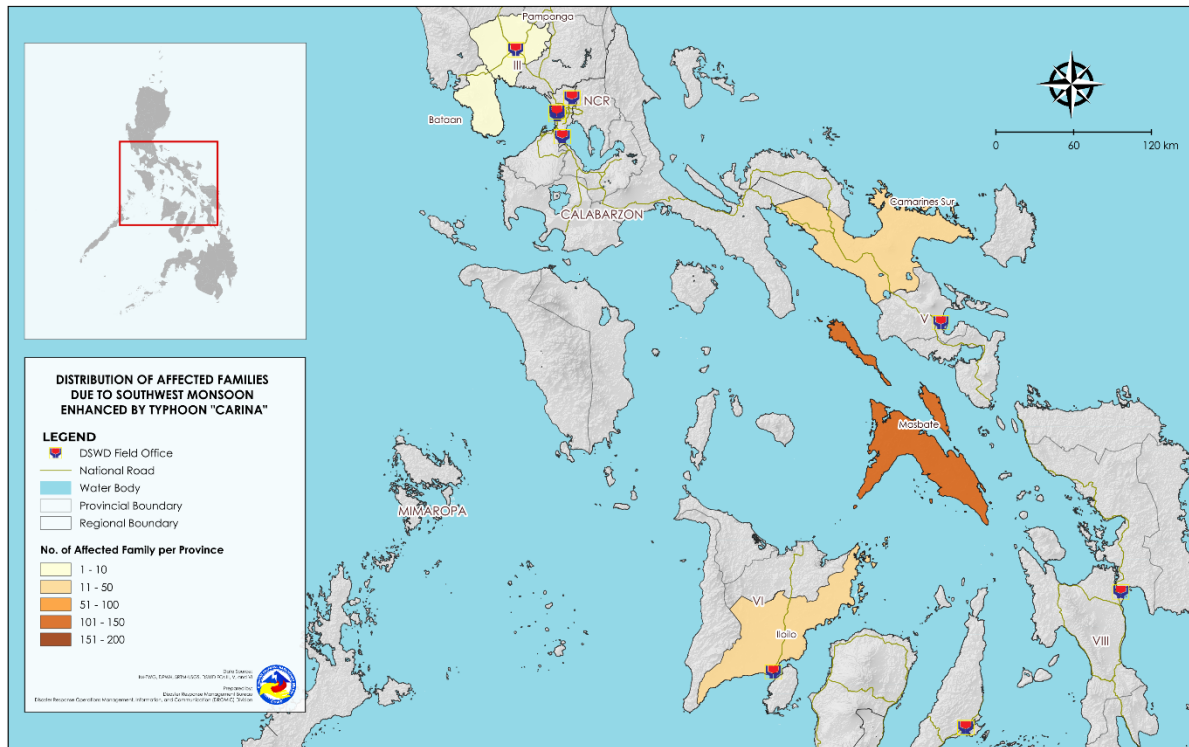
- Today: Ilocos Region, Abra, Benguet, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, Zambales, Bataan, Aurora, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, Northern Mindanao, and Davao Region
- Tomorrow: Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Region, Abra, Benguet, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, and Northern Mindanao
- Thursday: Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Negros Occidental, and Northern Samar

On 22 July 2024, in Central Luzon, the municipality of Mariveles in Bataan has reported the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon "CARINA". In the Bicol region, Locally Stranded Individuals (LSIs) have been reported at the Pasacao Port in Pasacao, Camarines Sur while a flooding incident was also experienced in Masbate City.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **224 families** or **975 persons** are affected in **14 barangays** in **Regions III, V and VI** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **46 families** or **152 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **six (6) evacuation centers** in **Regions III and VI** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **six (6) families** or **35 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **52 families** or **187 persons** displaced in **Regions III and VI** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **31 houses** were damaged; of which, **15 are totally damaged** and **16 are partially damaged** in **Region VI** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱190,124.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex G).
