
I. Situation Overview

On 29 May 2024, “AGHON” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **92,023 families** or **354,155 persons** are affected in **1,271 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, and Caraga** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **29 families** or **108 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2) evacuation centers** in **Region NCR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **19 families** or **69 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **48 families** or **177 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, and VI** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **45,520 houses** were damaged; of which, **3,368** are **totally damaged** and **42,152** are **partially damaged** in **Regions CALABARZON, V, VI, and VIII** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱46,049,302.22** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱34,937,557.79** from **DSWD**, **₱7,389,921.50** from the **Local Government Units (LGU)**, **₱6,020.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱3,715,802.93** from **Other Partners** (see Annex F).
