



DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Tropical Depression "Butchoy"

as of 20 July 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 19 July 2024 at 11:00 PM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) over the West Philippine Sea West of Batangas developed into Tropical Depression "BUTCHOY".

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

BUTCHOY is unlikely to directly affect the country within the next three days. However, the Southwest Monsoon that it enhances may still bring moderate to heavy rains over the western portion of Luzon over the next three days.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

BUTCHOY and the Southwest Monsoon will bring moderate to rough seas (1.0-2.0 m) over the coastal waters along the northern and western seaboards of Luzon. Mariners of motor bancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

BUTCHOY is forecast to move generally west northwestward until tomorrow (20 July) before turning more north northwestward beginning on Sunday (21 July). On the track forecast, this tropical depression may exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility within the next 12 hours. Furthermore, a landfall scenario over Hainan, China is likely by late Sunday or early Monday (22 July).

BUTCHOY will likely have limited intensification within the next two days, but is forecast to reach tropical storm category by tomorrow. Rapid weakening is possible after its landfall over Hainan, China on Monday.

The center of Tropical Depression BUTCHOY was estimated based on all available data over 535 km West of Tanauan City, Batangas (14.3 °N, 116.1 °E).



II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **8,593 families** or **33,288 persons** are affected in **89 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA**, **VI**, **VII, VIII and Caraga.** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **272 families** or **879 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **29** evacuation centers in Regions MIMAROPA, VI and VII (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **5,681 families** or **21,805 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

 c. Total Displaced Population There are 5,953 families or 22,684 persons displaced in Regions MIMAROPA, VI and VII (see Annex D).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱2,848,348.00 worth of assistance was provided by to the affected families composed of ₱2,722,600.00 from the DSWD and ₱125,748.00 from the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex E).
