

DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Typhoon “Carina” as of 24 July 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 24 July 2024 at 5:00 AM, Typhoon “Carina” continues to intensify while moving towards Taiwan.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Forecast accumulated rainfall: Today

- 50-100 mm: Batanes and Babuyan Islands

Forecast rainfall are generally higher in elevated or mountainous areas. Under these

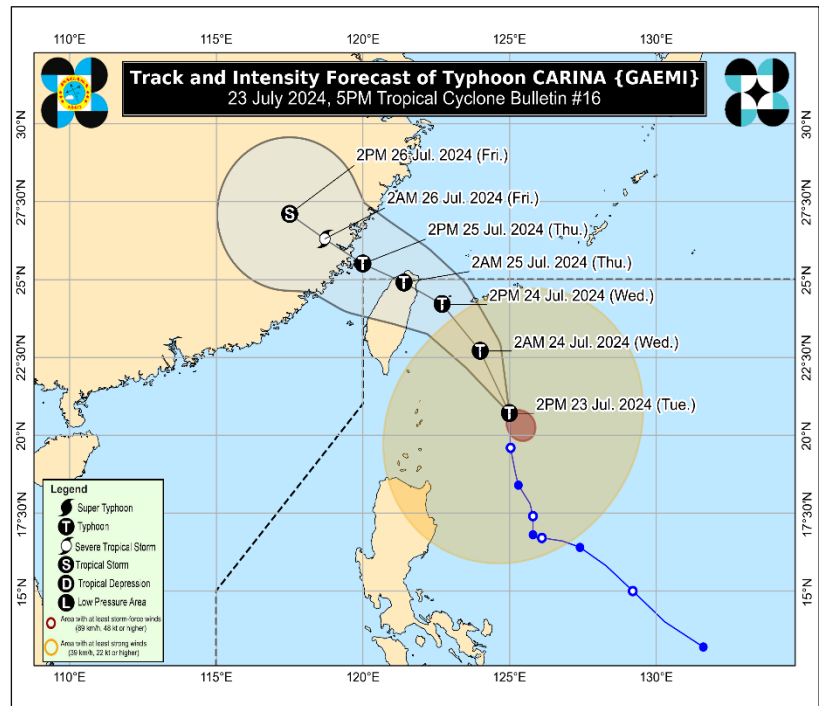
conditions, flooding and rain-induced landslides are possible especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards as identified in official hazard maps and in localities that experienced considerable amounts of rainfall for the past several days.

Furthermore, the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by “Carina” will bring moderate to intense rainfall over various localities in the western portion of Luzon today through Friday.

Severe Winds

The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

- Minor to moderate impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the localities where Wind Signal No. 2 is hoisted.
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The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by “Carina” will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- Today: Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, the eastern portion of Isabela, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, and Northern Mindanao
- Thursday (25 July): Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, the eastern portion of Isabela, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Negros Occidental, and Northern Samar
- Friday (26 July): Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, the eastern portion of Isabela, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, and Western Visayas.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

Gale Warning is in effect over the coastal waters of Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and the northern portion of Cagayan. Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas.

- In the next 24 hours, “Carina” and the enhanced Southwest Monsoon will bring rough seas over the seaboards of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Central Luzon (2.5 to 4.0 m). Moderate to rough seas are also expected over the western seaboard of Southern Luzon (1.5 to 3.5 m) and the eastern seaboards of Central and Southern Luzon (1.5 to 3.0 m) Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.
- Moderate to rough seas are also expected over the western seaboard of Southern Luzon (1.5 to 3.5 m) and the eastern seaboards of Central and Southern Luzon (1.5 to 3.0 m) Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- “Carina” is forecast to make landfall over the northern portion of Taiwan this afternoon or early evening. On the track forecast, the typhoon will cross the rugged terrain of Taiwan and exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) tonight or tomorrow (25 July) early morning. Outside the PAR Region, CARINA will cross the Taiwan Strait and make its final landfall over southeastern China tomorrow morning or early afternoon.
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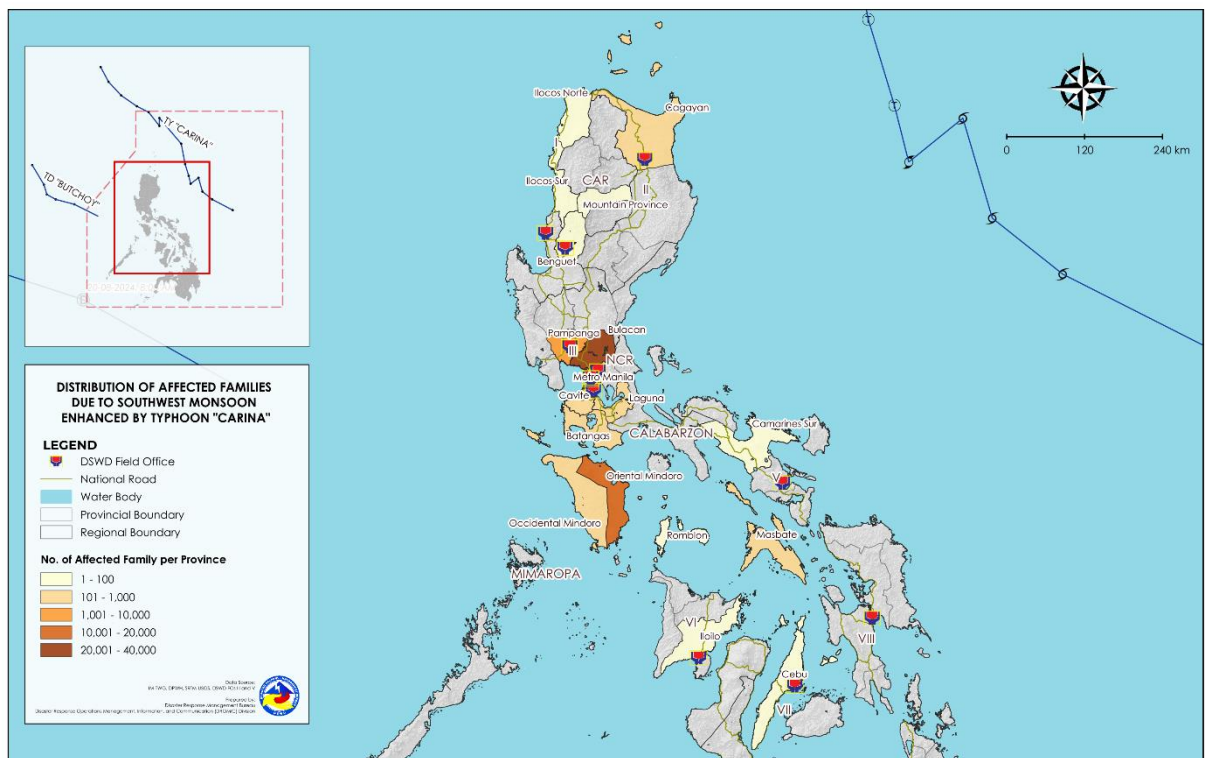
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The center of the eye was estimated based on all available data 290 km Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes (22.9 °N, 123.5 °E) moving Northwestward 25 km/h with maximum sustained winds of 155 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 190 km/h.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **45,328 families** or **191,062 persons** are affected in **225 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **1,702 families** or **6,524 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **126 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, VI, and VII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **376 families** or **1,512 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **2,078 families** or **8,036 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, VI, VII, and CAR** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **175 houses** were damaged; of which, **15 are totally damaged** and **160 are partially damaged** in **Regions V, VI, and CAR** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱410,325.36** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱380,390.36** from **DSWD** and **₱29,935.00** from the **Local Government Unit** (see Annex G).
