





DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon as of 14 July 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 12 July 2024 at 4:00 AM, the Southwest Monsoon may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains to the western sections of Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao


On the same day, heavy rainfall in Datu Montawal (Papagawan), Maguindanao del Sur caused the Pulangi / Rio Grande de Mindanao River to rise and consequently, resulted to flooding in some low-lying barangays. Sustained heavy rains also caused the Tual, Nalus, and Pangi Rivers to overflow and subsequently submerge several houses in Kiamba, Sarangani.

On 12 July 2024, several areas in Zamboanga Peninsula including Zamboanga City, Zamboanga del Sur and Zamboanga del Norte, experienced flooding due to continuous rainfall brought by the Southwest Monsoon.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **54,729 families** or **265,806 persons** are affected in **175 barangays** in **Regions IX**, **XII** and **BARMM**. (see Annex A).









III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **5,027 families** or **20,359 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **56 evacuation centers** in **Regions IX** and **XII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are 6,525 families or 32,195 persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are 11,552 families or 52,554 persons displaced in Regions IX and XII (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **77 houses** were damaged; of which, **41** are **totally damaged** and **36** are **partially damaged** in **Regions IX** and **XII** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱4,609,721.50 worth of assistance was provided by DSWD to the affected families (see Annex G).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱82.02 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.

National Resource and Logistics Management Bureau (NRLMB) ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as need arises.

DSWD FO XII deployed its Quick Response Team (QRT) members to conduct validation and assessment to the affected families and persons in the affected areas.
