## **DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) as of 14 July 2024, 6AM**

### **I. Situation Overview**

Issued on 07 July 2024 at 4:00 AM, Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao. Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms.

On 07 July 2024, heavy rainfall brought by the ITCZ caused significant flooding in the municipalities of Sultan Kudarat and Mother Kabuntalan in Maguindanao del Norte.

On the same day, a flooding incident occurred in Brgy. Angeles, Tambulig, Zamboanga del Sur brought by continuous heavy rains brought also by the presence of ITCZ.

Issued on 09 July 2024 at 4:00 PM, ITCZ is still affecting Palawan, Visayas and Mindanao. Partly cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in the aforementioned areas.

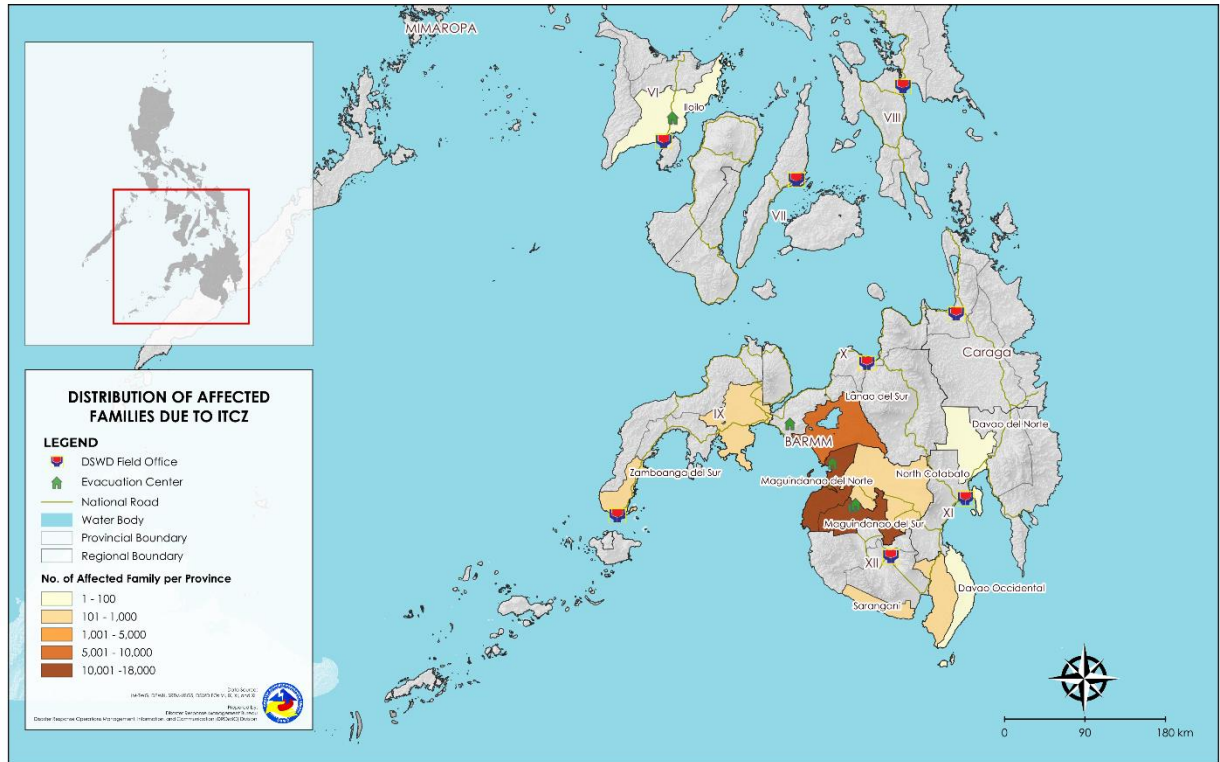
On 09 July 2024, the municipality of Jose Abad Santos in Davao Occidental experienced flash flood caused by the said weather disturbance. On the same day at around 6:00 PM, sustained heavy downpour brought by the ITCZ caused flashfloods to low-lying barangays in Matanog, and Parang Maguindanao del Norte; Datu Piang and Datu Anggal Midtimbang in Maguindanao del Sur; municipalities of Balabagan, Kapatagan, Malabang and Marogong in Lanao del Sur; and Alabel in Sarangani Province.

Further, at around 11:00 PM, heavy rains were also experienced in Pototan, Iloilo which caused flooding in low-lying areas, particularly in Brgy. Cau-ayan and Brgy. Malusgod.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **34,433 families** or **171,923 persons** are affected in **172 barangays** in **Regions VI, IX, XI, XII** and **BARMM** (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **904 families** or **4,500 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **10 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI, XI** and **BARMM** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **76 families** or **345 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **980 families** or **4,845 persons** displaced in **Regions VI, XI** and **BARMM** (see Annex F).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **451 houses** were damaged; of which, **308** are **totally damaged** and **143** are **partially damaged** in **Regions XI, XII** and **BARMM** (see Annex G).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱16,839,307.52** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱16,710,907.52** from **DSWD** and **₱128,400.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex H).
