

# DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in Sultan Kudarat

as of 29 July 2024, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

Issued on 26 June 2024 at 4:00PM, a Low-Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 235 km East of General Santos City (6.3°N, 127.2°E). It is embedded along the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting Mindanao.

On 26 June 2024 at around 5:30 PM, several barangays in the municipalities of Lambayong and Esperanza in Sultan Kudarat experienced incidents of flash flood due to the effects of the ITCZ and the LPA embedded along it. On the same day, heavy rains were also experienced in the municipality of Bagumbayan, Sultan Kudarat.

On 01 July 2024, the municipality of Lutayan, Sultan Kudaran also reported a flashflood incident caused by the prevailing ITCZ.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,186 families** or **4,139 persons** are affected in **11 barangays** in **Sultan Kudarat** (see Annex A).

## III. Status of Displaced Population

### Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **13 families** or **65 persons** sought temporary shelter at the **Brgy. Masiag Gymnasium** in **Bagumbayan, Sultan Kudarat** (see Annex B).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **20 houses** were damaged; of which, **seven (7)** are **totally damaged** and **13** are **partially damaged** in **Bagumbayan, Sultan Kudarat** (see Annex C).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱608,993.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex D).
