

DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon as of 15 July 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 12 July 2024 at 4:00 AM, the Southwest Monsoon may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains to the western sections of Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao

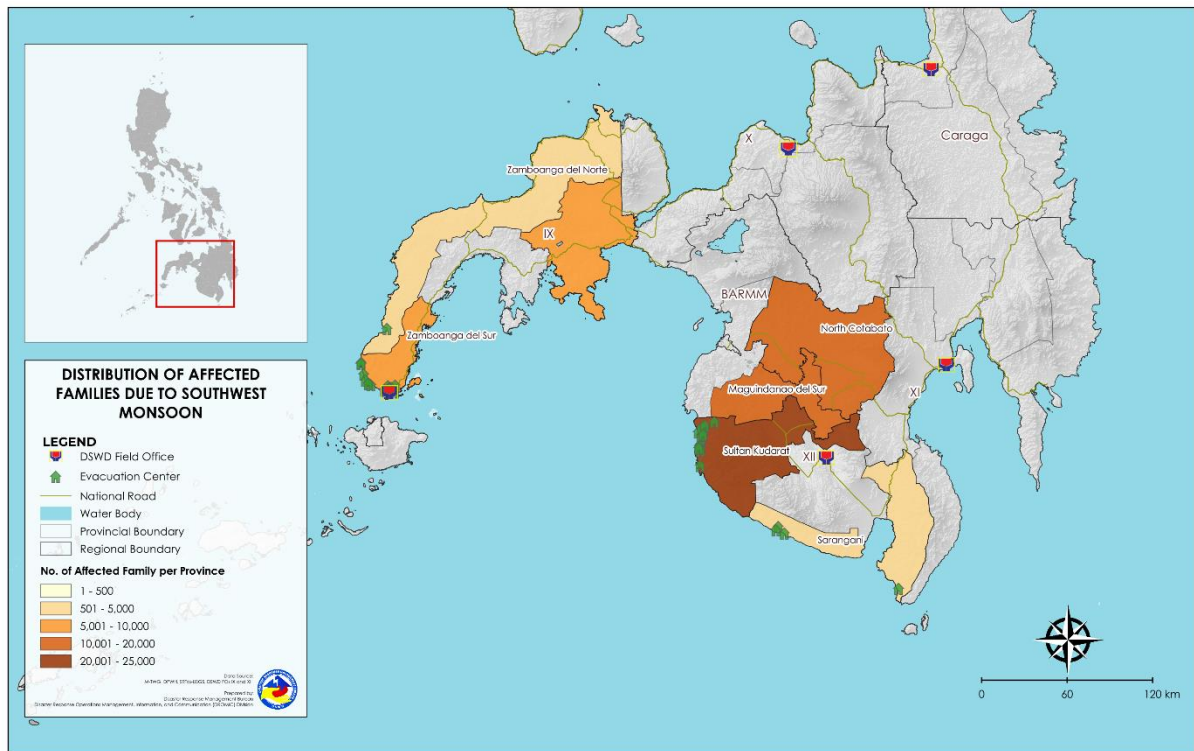
On the same day, heavy rainfall in Datu Montawal (Papagawan), Maguindanao del Sur caused the Pulangi / Rio Grande de Mindanao River to rise and consequently, resulted to flooding in some low-lying barangays. Sustained heavy rains also caused the Tual, Nalus, and Pangi Rivers to overflow and subsequently submerge several houses in Kiamba, Sarangani.

On 12 July 2024, several areas in Zamboanga Peninsula including Zamboanga City, Zamboanga del Sur and Zamboanga del Norte, experienced flooding due to continuous rainfall brought by the Southwest Monsoon.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **74,989 families** or **361,551 persons** are affected in **211 barangays** in **Regions IX, XII** and **BARMM**. (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **5,113 families** or **18,831 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **51 evacuation centers** in **Regions IX and XII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **7,090 families** or **35,340 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **12,203 families** or **54,171 persons** displaced in **Regions IX and XII** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **90 houses** were damaged; of which, **49** are **totally damaged** and **41** are **partially damaged** in **Regions IX and XII** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱8,512,718.60** worth of assistance was provided by to the affected families; of which **₱7,937,718.60** from the **DSWD** and **₱575,000.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex G).
