

DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on Tropical Depression “Butchoy” as of 22 July 2024, 6AM

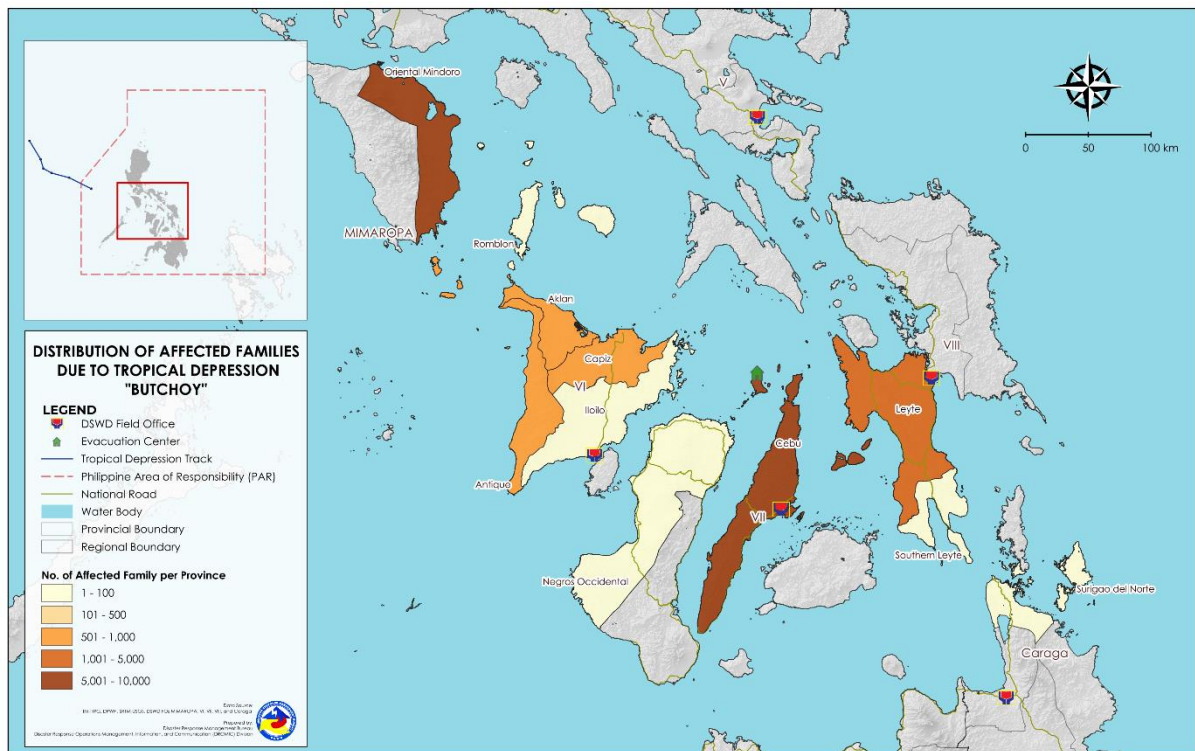
I. Situation Overview

On 20 July 2024, Tropical Depression (TD) “Butchoy” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **20,224 families** or **78,725 persons** are affected in **130 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, VI, VII, VIII and Caraga** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **113 families** or **552 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **three (3) evacuation centers** in **Region VII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **12,144 families** or **48,599 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **113 families** or **552 persons** displaced in **Region VII** (see Annex D).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱3,307,423.91** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱3,068,490.16** from **DSWD** and **₱238,933.75** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex E).
