

DSWD DROMIC Report #7 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon “Carina” as of 25 July 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

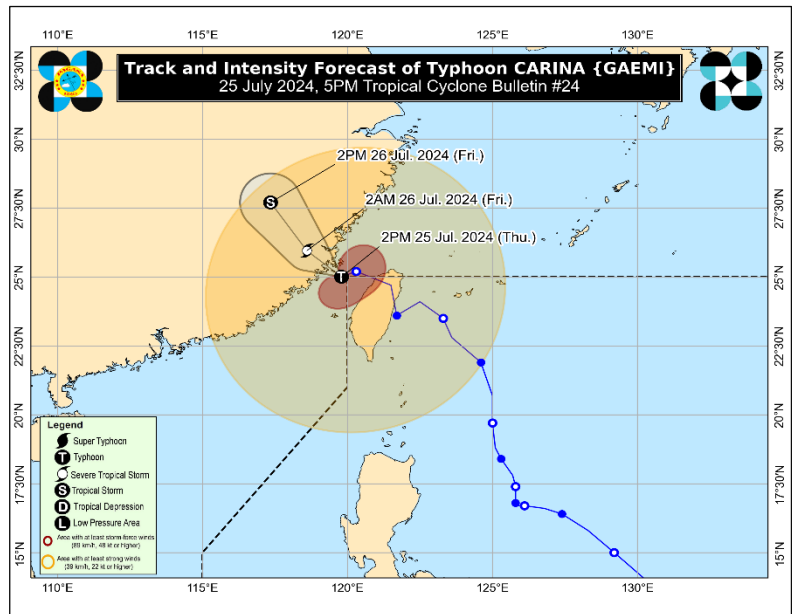
Issued on 25 July 2024 at 5:00 PM, “Carina” continues to weaken and is now over Southeastern China

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

- Typhoon “Carina” is now less likely to directly bring heavy rainfall over any portion of the country. However, the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by CARINA

will bring heavy to intense rainfall over Ilocos Region, Abra, Apayao, Benguet, Zambales, and Bataan for tonight while moderate to heavy rainfall over various localities in the western portion of Luzon from tonight through Saturday. Severe Winds

The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

- Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.

The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by CARINA will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- Today and tomorrow (26 July): Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, the eastern portion of Isabela, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Negros Occidental, and Northern Samar

- Saturday (27 July): Batanes, Ilocos Region, Zambales, Bataan, Marinduque, Romblon, and Kalayaan Islands.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

- Gale Warning is in effect over the coastal waters of Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, and northwestern Cagayan. Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas. For more information, refer to Gale Warning No. 7 issued at 5:00 PM today.
- In the next 24 hours, CARINA and the enhanced Southwest Monsoon will bring rough seas over the western seaboard of Central Luzon (2.5 to 4.0 m). Moderate to rough seas are also expected over the northern and western seaboards of Northern Luzon outside Gale Warning areas, the western seaboard of Southern Luzon (1.5 to 4.0 m), and the eastern seaboard of Northern Luzon (1.5 to 3.5 m). Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.
- Up to moderate seas are also expected over the eastern seaboards of Central and Southern Luzon, the southern seaboard of Southern Luzon (1.0 to 2.5 m), the western and eastern seaboards of Visayas, and the eastern seaboard of Mindanao (1.0 to 2.0 m). Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

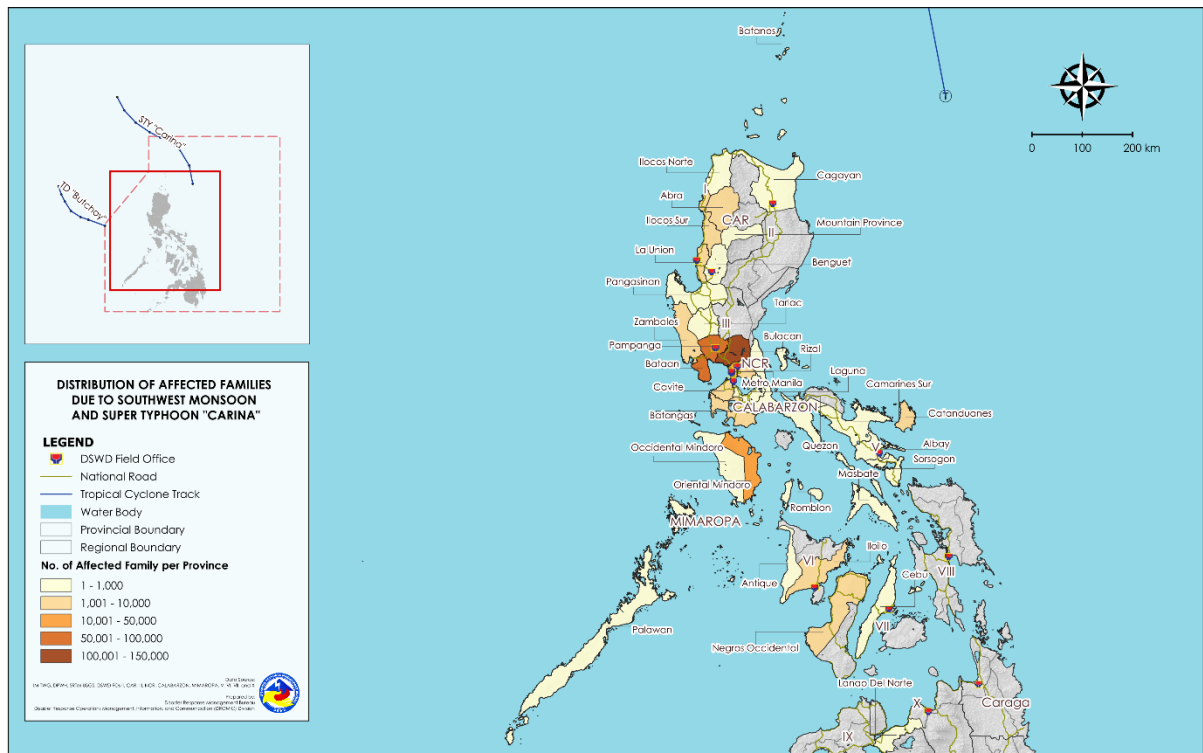
Outside PAR region, CARINA will continue to move west northwestward over Southeastern China. It will continue to weaken as it further interacts with the landmass.

The center of the eye was estimated based on all available data 550 km North Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (25.3 °N, 119.6 °E) moving West Southwestward 10 km/h with maximum sustained winds of 120 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 180 km/h.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **405,917 families** or **1,320,728 persons** are affected in **1,429 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **52,917 families** or **204,446 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **1,064 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, VI, VII and CAR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **19,940 families** or **69,776 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **72,857 families** or **274,222 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, VI, VII, and CAR** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **169 houses** were damaged; of which, **34 are totally damaged** and **135 are partially damaged** in **Regions I, MIMAROPA, V, VI, X and CAR** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱48,434,438.79** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱47,924,299.08** from **DSWD** and **₱481,009.71** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱20,000.00** from **Non-Government Organizations** and **₱9,130.00** from **other Partners** (see Annex G).
