





DSWD DROMIC Report #7 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon as of 17 July 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 12 July 2024 at 4:00 AM, the Southwest Monsoon may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains to the western sections of Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao

On the same day, heavy rainfall in Datu Montawal (Papagawan), Maguindanao del Sur caused the Pulangi / Rio Grande de Mindanao River to rise and consequently, resulted to flooding in some low-lying barangays. Sustained heavy rains also caused the Tual, Nalus, and Pangi Rivers to overflow and subsequently submerge several houses in Kiamba, Sarangani.


On 12 July 2024, several areas in Zamboanga Peninsula including Zamboanga City, Zamboanga del Sur and Zamboanga del Norte, experienced flooding due to continuous rainfall brought by the Southwest Monsoon.

On 13 July 2024, Mandaue City and Santa Catalina, Negros Oriental, experienced flooding and landslide incident brought by effects of Southwest Monsoon.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **94,059 families** or **445,866 persons** are affected in **254 barangays** in **Regions VII, IX, XII** and **BARMM.** (see Annex A).









III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 5,002 families or 18,434 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 42 evacuation centers in Regions VII, IX and XII (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **24,558 families** or **122,701 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are 29,560 families or 141,135 persons displaced in Regions VII, IX and XII (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of 123 houses were damaged; of which, 73 are totally damaged and 50 are partially damaged in Regions VII, IX and XII (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}20,088,515.50\$ worth of assistance was provided by to the affected families composed of \$\mathbb{P}19,513,515.50\$ from the \$\mathbb{D}SWD\$ and \$\mathbb{P}575,000.00\$ from the \$\mathbb{Local}\$ Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex H).
