

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Mw 6.8 Earthquake Incident in Lingig, Surigao Del Sur as of 05 August 2024, 6AM

### I. Situation Overview

On 03 August 2024 6:22 AM, a 6.8-magnitude earthquake jolted the Municipality of Lingig, Surigao del Sur (08.12°N, 127.16°E - 083 km N 84° E). The earthquake was also felt in the neighboring municipalities.

A total of **9,341 families** or **29,440 persons** are affected in **13 barangays** in **Lingig, Surigao del Sur** (see Annex A).

## III. Status of Displaced Population

### Outside Evacuation Center

There are **14 families** or **56 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex B).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **193 houses** were damaged; of which, **two (2)** are **totally damaged** and **191** are **partially damaged** in **Lingig, Surigao del Sur** (see Annex C).
