

DSWD DROMIC Report #18 on Tropical Depression “Butchoy” as of 03 September 2024, 6PM

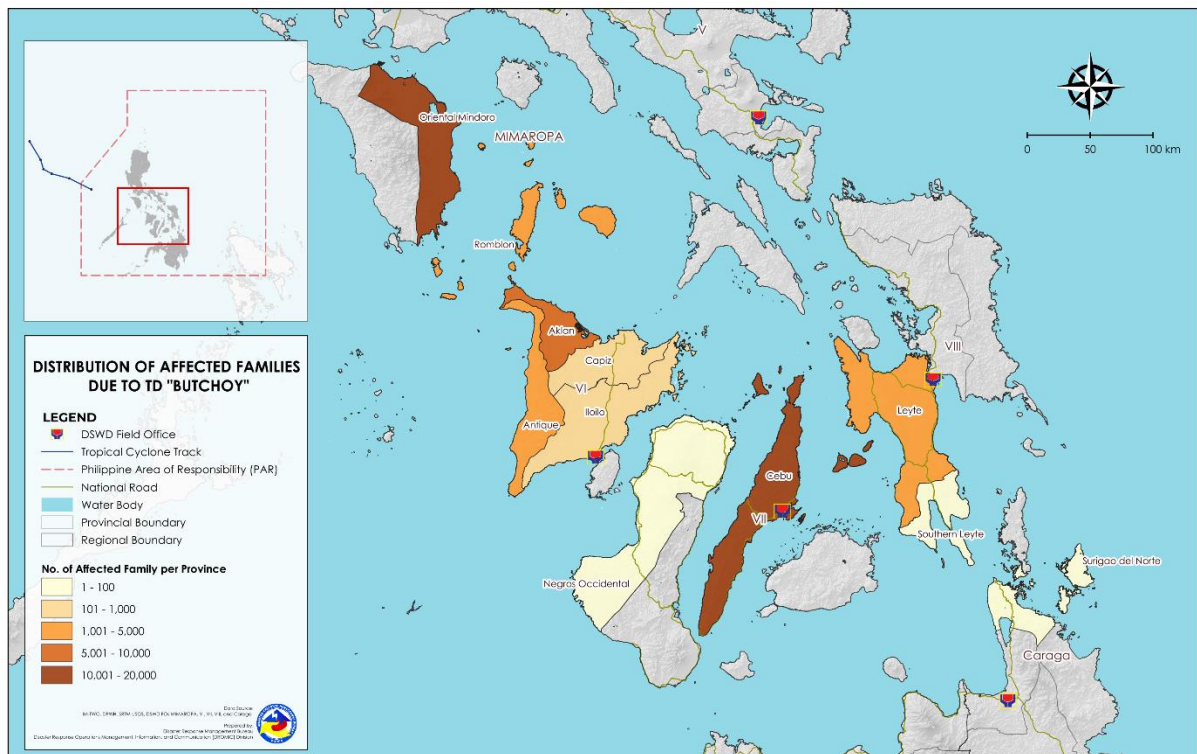
I. Situation Overview

On 20 July 2024, Tropical Depression (TD) “Butchoy” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **46,396 families** or **139,919 persons** are affected in **210 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, VI, VII, VIII and Caraga** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **1,318 families** or **5,019 persons** sought temporary shelter in **89 evacuation centers** in **Regions MIMAROPA, VI, and VII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **10,062 families** or **38,253 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

A total of **11,380 families** or **43,272 persons** were displaced in **Regions MIMAROPA, VI, and VII** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **105 houses** were damaged; of which, **18** are **totally damaged** and **87** are **partially damaged** in Regions **MIMAROPA, VI, and VII** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱11,907,625.08** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱8,669,676.08** from **DSWD** and **₱3,237,949.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex F).
