

# **DSWD DROMIC Report #22 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon “Carina”**

as of 02 August 2024, 6AM

## I. Situation Overview


On 21 July 2024, the effects of Southwest Monsoon and “Carina” brought heavy rains in several municipalities in the country that resulted in the displacement of families and persons.

On 25 July 2024, Super Typhoon “Carina” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,438,720 families** or **5,161,224 persons** are affected in **4,155 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X, and CAR** (see Annex A).



### **III. Status of Displaced Population**

**a. Inside Evacuation Center**

There are **5,027 families** or **19,440 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **154 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, II, III, CALABARZON**, and **CAR** (see Annex B).

**b. Outside Evacuation Center**

There are **115,692 families** or **463,820 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

**c. Total Displaced Population**

There are **120,719 families** or **483,260 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, and CAR** (see Annex F).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **8,592 houses** were damaged; of which, **1,117** are **totally damaged** and **7,475** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X, and CAR** (see Annex G).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱424,248,312.17** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱294,760,424.56** from **DSWD** and **₱126,952,425.97** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱1,333,484.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱1,201,977.64** from **Other Partners** (see Annex H).
