

DSWD DROMIC Report #33 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon “Carina” as of 07 August 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

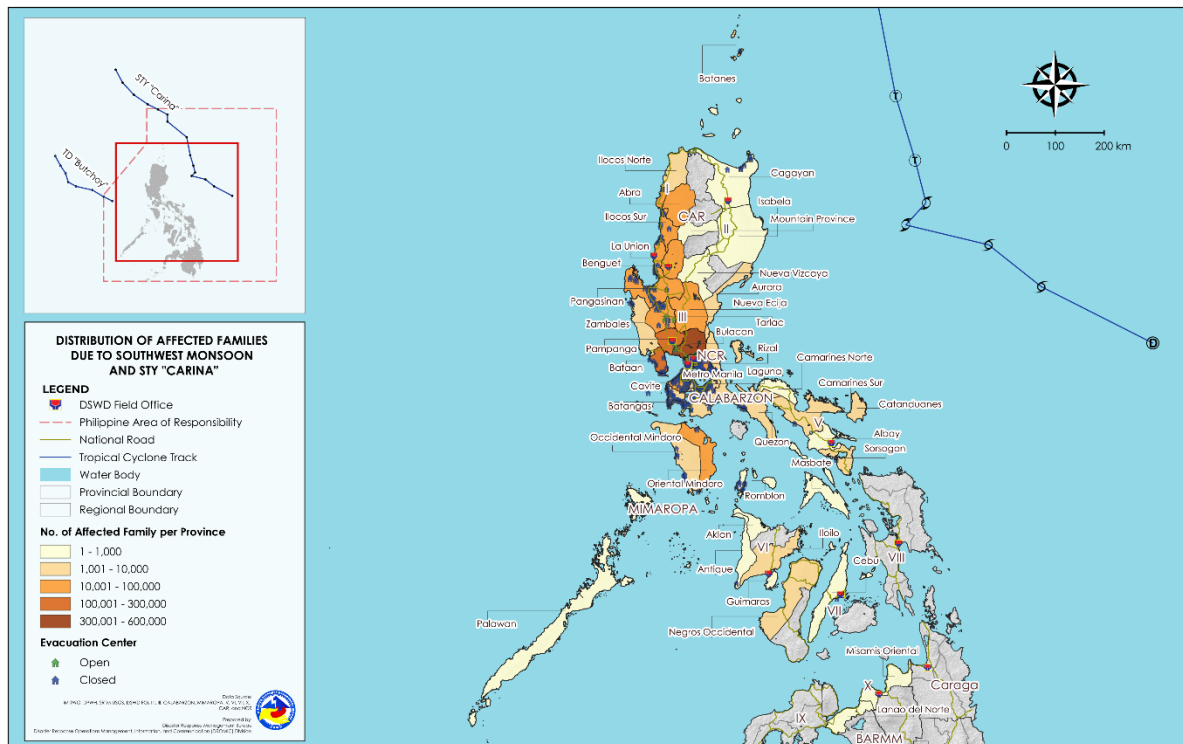
On 21 July 2024, the effects of Southwest Monsoon and “Carina” brought heavy rains in several municipalities in the country that resulted in the displacement of families and persons.

On 25 July 2024, Super Typhoon “Carina” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,492,759 families** or **5,387,695 persons** are affected in **4,510 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **2,857 families** or **11,163 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **100 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, II, III, and CALABARZON** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **146,581 families** or **587,150 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **149,438 families** or **598,313 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, and CAR** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **8,429 houses** were damaged; of which, **1,118** are **totally damaged** and **7,311** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X, and CAR** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱487,178,401.05** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱340,944,637.90** from **DSWD** and **₱143,478,301.51** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱1,333,484.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱1,421,977.64** from **Other Partners** (see Annex G).
