
DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Oil Spill Incident in Limay, Bataan

as of 12 August 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 25 July 2024, the Motor Tanker (MT) Terra Nova, a Philippine-flagged Oil Tanker, sank in the waters of Limay, Bataan, causing an Oil Spill.

Reports indicated that the MT Terra Nova was loaded with 1.4 million liters of industrial oil before the incident. The sinking was primarily caused by heavy rainfall and strong winds from the Southwest Monsoon, which were further intensified by Super Typhoon “Carina”.

The concerned Local Government Units (LGUs) of Bataan, in coordination with various National Government Agencies (NGAs), immediately implemented containment strategies to mitigate the spread of the Oil Spill.

On 29 July 2024, the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) found an oil sheen on the shorelines of Tanza and Ternate, Cavite. The Provincial Government of Cavite initiated a simultaneous clean-up drive in the coastal areas.

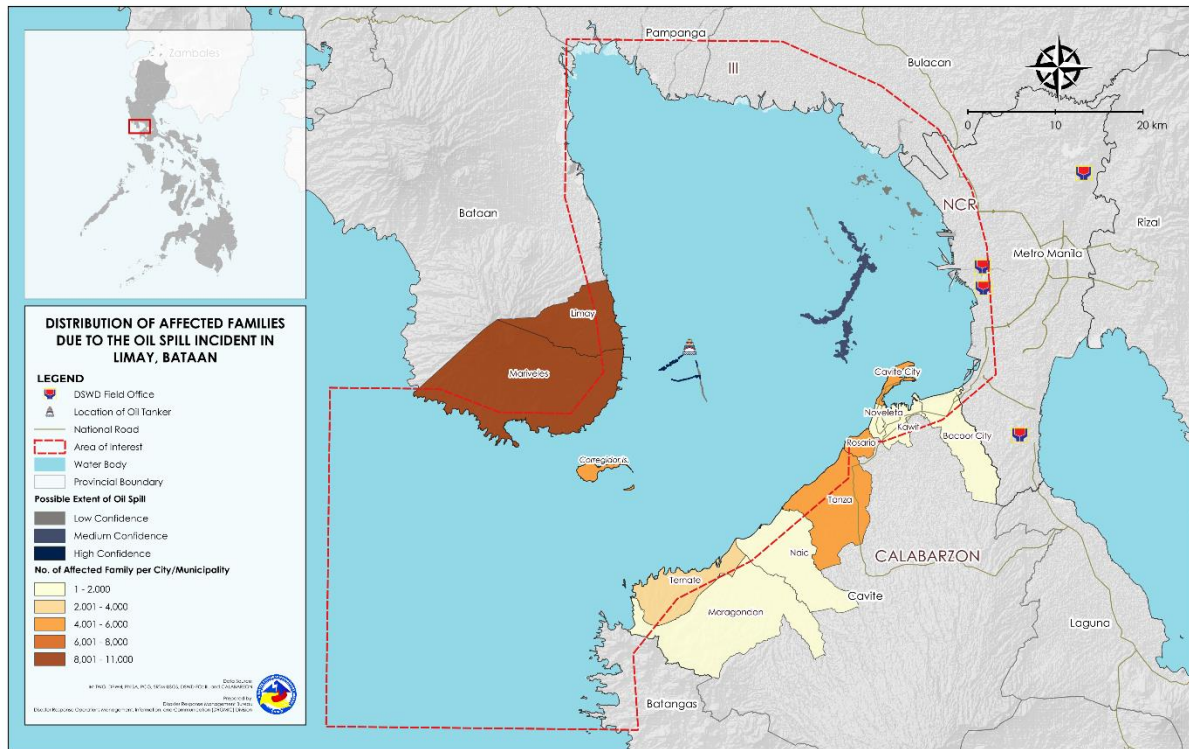
On 31 July 2024, the Provincial Government of Cavite declared a State of Calamity (SOC) for the municipalities of Bacoor, Kawit, Noveleta, Rosario, Tanza, Naic, Maragondon, Ternate and Cavite City.

On 05 August 2024, the Provincial Government of Bataan placed the whole province under State of Calamity.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **44,983 families** or **167,857 persons** are affected in **217 barangays** in **Regions III and CALABARZON** (see Annex A).
