





DSWD DROMIC Report on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Poblacion, San Rafael, Iloilo

28 August 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On August 6, 2024, at around 1:00 PM, a fire incident occurred at the Municipal Market in Barangay Poblacion, San Rafael, Iloilo, and was declared out at around 3:00 PM. The fire completely destroyed 35 market stalls, severely affecting the livelihood of the stall owners, vendors, and tenants.

Relative to the incident, the DSWD through its Field Office in Region VI provided relief assistance to support the immediate needs of the affected populace.

A total of **100 families** or **384 persons** were affected in **Brgy. Poblacion, San Rafael, Iloilo** (see Annex A).


