

## DSWD DROMIC Report #10 on the Effects of Severe Tropical Storm “Enteng” and Southwest Monsoon

as of 06 September 2024, 6AM


### I. Situation Overview

Issued at 5:00 AM, 04 September 2024, “Enteng” slightly intensifies and is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **632,610 families** or **2,402,501 persons** are affected in **2,359 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **9,433 families** or **35,399 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **386 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, III, CALABARZON, V** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **11,676 families** or **34,607 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **21,109 families** or **70,006 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, and CAR** (see Annex E).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **6,403 houses** were damaged; of which, **98** are **totally damaged** and **6,305** are **partially damaged** in **Region I, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR** (see Annex F).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱153,103,934.68** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱146,894,086.70** from **DSWD**, **₱5,832,208.98** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱152,311.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱225,328.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex G).
