

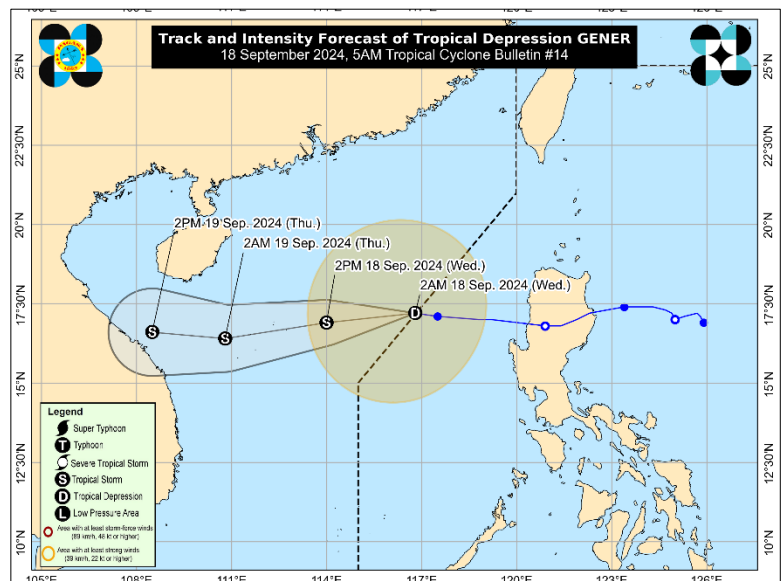
DSWD DROMIC Report #10 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon, Tropical Storm "Ferdie", and Tropical Depression "Gener" as of 18 September 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 18 September 2024 at 5:00 AM, Tropical Depression "Gener" is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

Severe Winds

The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by "Gener" and "Helen" will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):



- Today: Zambales, Bataan, Pampanga, Bulacan, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas,
- Tomorrow (19 September): Ilocos Region, Isabela, Aurora, Zambales, Bataan, Metro Manila, CALABARZON,
- Thursday (20 September): Ilocos Region, Isabela, Aurora, Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Quezon, Occidental Mindoro, Marinduque, and Romblon

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Gale Warning is in effect over several coastal waters in the western seaboard of Central Luzon, Southern Luzon, and Visayas. Sea travel in these waters is risky for small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas.

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters outside Gale Warning areas:

- 1.0 to 3.5 m: The northern seaboards of Cagayan Valley and Zamboanga Peninsula, the seaboards of Caraga and Ilocos Region; the eastern seaboards of Bicol Region, Davao Region, and Eastern Visayas; the western and southern seaboards of CALABARZON and Negros Island Region.
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **18,090 families** or **70,244 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **580 evacuation centers** in **Regions II, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, XII,** and **BARMM** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **11,596 families** or **48,372 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **29,686 families** or **118,616 persons** displaced in **Regions II, III MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, X, XII,** and **BARMM** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **1,300 houses** were damaged; of which, **227** are **totally damaged** and **1,073** are **partially damaged** in **Regions II, V, VI, VII, IX, X, XII,** and **BARMM** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱32,873,065.08** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱28,959,102.78** from **DSWD**, **₱3,777,782.30** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, and **₱136,180.00** from the **Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs)** (see Annex H).
