
I. Situation Overview

On 04 September 2024, "Enteng" exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **707,793 families** or **2,517,498 persons** are affected in **2,413 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **8,665 families** or **32,145 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **407 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, V** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **17,446 families** or **48,960 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **26,111 families** or **81,105 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, and CAR** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **6,412 houses** were damaged; of which, **98** are **totally damaged** and **6,314** are **partially damaged** in **Region I, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱153,558,567.68** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱147,146,961.70** from **DSWD**, **₱6,033,966.98** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱152,311.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱225,328.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex G).
