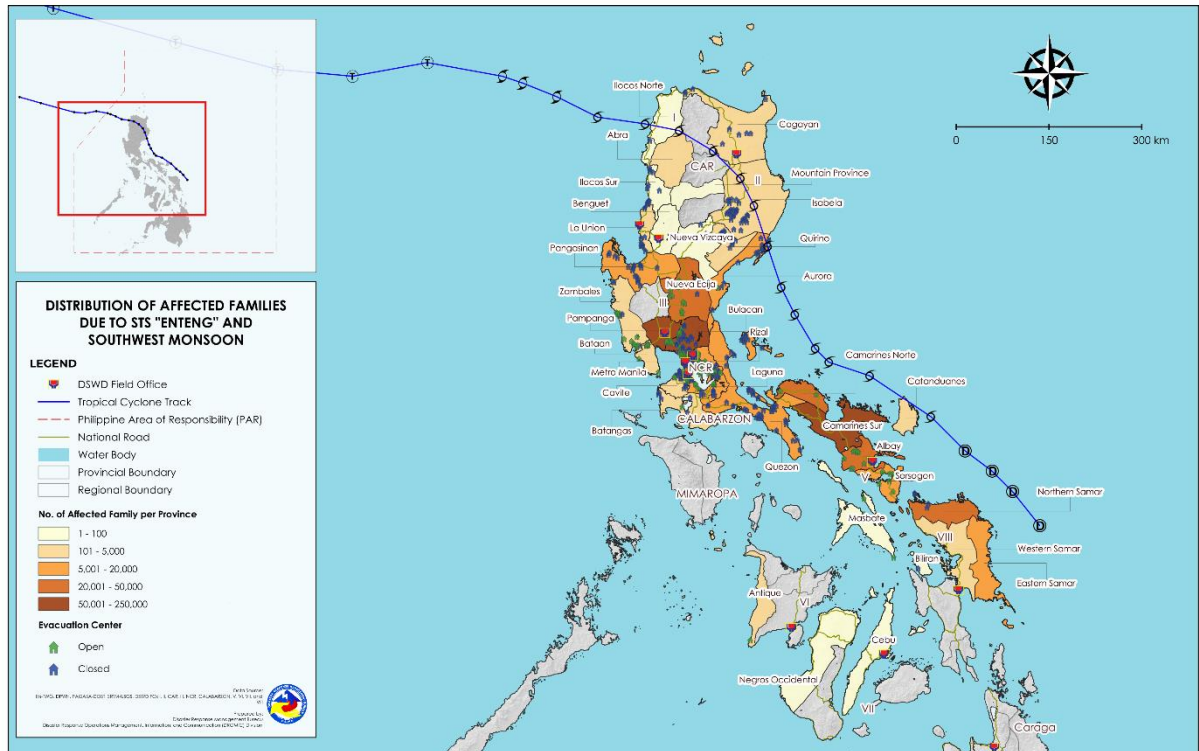
I. Situation Overview

On 04 September 2024, “Enteng” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **793,091 families** or **2,826,830 persons** are affected in **2,648 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **8,149 families** or **28,411 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **372 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, V** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **17,843 families** or **50,130 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **25,992 families** or **78,541 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, V, VII, and CAR** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **6,473 houses** were damaged; of which, **112** are **totally damaged** and **6,361** are **partially damaged** in **Region I, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱203,122,927.60** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱192,529,113.32** from **DSWD**, **₱9,733,795.28** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱634,691.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱225,328.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex G).
