


## DSWD DROMIC Report #12 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon, Tropical Storm "Ferdie", Tropical Depression "Gener", and Tropical Storm "Helen" as of 19 September 2024, 6AM

### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 18 September 2024 at 11:00 PM, Tropical Storm "Helen" is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

#### HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Refer to Weather Advisory No. 34 issued at 11:00 PM today for the heavy rainfall outlook due to the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by GENER and HELEN.



#### Severe Winds

The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by GENER and HELEN will continue to bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- Tonight and Tomorrow (19 September): Ilocos Region, Isabela, Aurora, Zambales, Bataan, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Negros Island Region, and Zamboanga Peninsula
- Friday (20 September): Batanes, Babuyan Islands Ilocos Region, Abra, Benguet, Aurora, Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Quezon, Occidental Mindoro, Marinduque, Romblon, and Kalayaan Islands
- Saturday (21 September): Batanes, Babuyan Islands Ilocos Region, Abra, Benguet, and Zambales

#### HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

#### 24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Gale Warning is in effect over several coastal waters in the western seaboard of Central Luzon, the seaboard of Occidental Mindoro, and the western seaboard of Palawan including Kalayaan Islands. Sea travel in these waters is risky for small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas.

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters outside Gale Warning areas:

- 1.5 to 3.5 m: The seaboards of Batanes and Ilocos Region; the eastern seashore of Palawan (including seaboards of Cuyo Islands); seashore of Antique
- 1.0 to 3.0 m: The northern and eastern seashore of Cagayan Valley; the remaining western seaboards of Western Visayas; the western seashore of Negros Island Region; the remaining seaboards of MIMAROPA
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters outside Gale Warning areas:

- Up to 2.5 m: The eastern seashore of Bicol Region; the southern seashore of southern Quezon; the seashore of Cagayancillo Islands; the northern and eastern seaboards of Northern Samar; the eastern seashore of Eastern Samar; the seashore of Caraga Region; the eastern seashore of Davao Oriental; the seashore of Southern Leyte, the southern seaboards of Negros Island Region and Central Visayas; the seashore of Zamboanga del Norte; the seashore of Northern Mindanao.
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions.

## TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK


- After making landfall in Kunigami, Okinawa, Japan at 10:20 PM tonight, "Helen" will continue its fast northwestward or west northwestward movement over the East China until it makes landfall over mainland China tomorrow afternoon or evening as a tropical storm.

The center of the eye was estimated based on all available data 915 km Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR) (26.6 °N, 128.2 °E) while moving Northwestward at 40 km/h with maximum sustained winds of 85 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 105 km/h.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **401,653 families** or **1,364,934** are affected in **1,846 barangays** in **Regions II, III, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XII, CAR, and BARMM** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **19,026 families** or **72,896 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **594 evacuation centers** in **Regions II, III, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, X, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **17,028 families** or **73,748 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **36,054 families** or **146,644 persons** displaced in **Regions II, III, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, X, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex F).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **1,810 houses** were damaged; of which, **275** are **totally damaged** and **1,531** are **partially damaged** in **Regions II, V, VI, VII, IX, X, XII, CAR and BARMM** (see Annex G).

### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱44,076,456.29** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱38,084,284.87** from **DSWD**, **₱5,671,516.30** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱136,180.00** from the **Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱184,475.12** from **other Partners** (see Annex H).
