
I. Situation Overview

On 04 September 2024, “Enteng” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **785,763 families** or **2,960,059 persons** are affected in **2,821 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **5,400 families** or **20,041 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **258 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, V, and CAR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **19,025 families** or **50,829 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **24,425 families** or **70,870 persons** still displaced in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, V, VII, and CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **6,499 houses** were damaged; of which, **114** are **totally damaged** and **6,385** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱267,310,182.53** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱250,781,422.05** from **DSWD**, **₱15,668,741.48** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱634,691.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱225,328.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex H).
