

# DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm “Ferdie” as of 14 September 2024, 6AM

## I. Situation Overview

Issued on 14 September 2024 at 5:00 AM, Tropical Storm “Ferdie” is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

### HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

#### Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Forecast accumulated rainfall: Today

- 100-200 mm: MIMAROPA, Western Visayas and Occidental Negros

- 50-100 mm:

Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, the southern portion of Quezon, Bicol Region, the rest of Visayas, Misamis Occidental, Zamboanga del Norte, Lanao del Norte, Lanao del Sur, Maguindanao del Norte, Maguindanao del Sur, Sultan Kudarat, Sarangani, Basilan, Sulu, and Tawi-Tawi

Forecast accumulated rainfall: Tomorrow (15 September)

- 100-200 mm: Occidental Mindoro, the northern portion of Palawan, Aklan, and Antique
- 50-100 mm: The southern portion of Quezon, Bicol Region, the rest of MIMAROPA, Negros Island Region, and the rest of Western Visayas

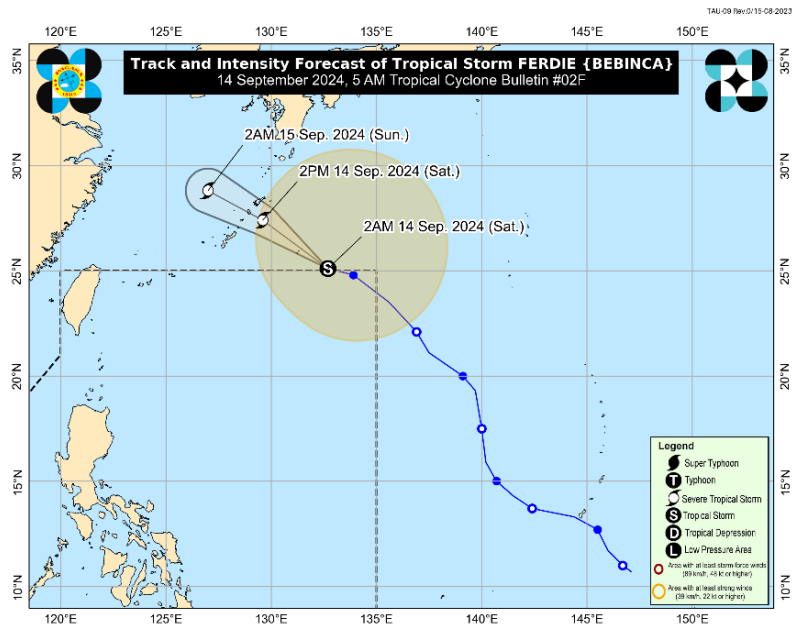
Forecast accumulated rainfall: Monday (16 September)

- 100-200 mm: Occidental Mindoro and the northern portion of Palawan
- 50-100 mm: The rest of MIMAROPA, Camarines Sur, Catanduanes, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate, Negros Occidental, and Western Visayas

Under these conditions, flooding and rain-induced landslides are likely, especially in areas that are highly or very susceptible to these hazards as identified in hazard maps and in areas with significant antecedent rainfall.

### Severe Winds

The enhanced Southwest Monsoon will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):



- Today: Batangas, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, Caraga Region, Northern Mindanao, Zamboanga Peninsula, BARMM, and Davao Region.
- Tomorrow: Batangas, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, Caraga Region, Northern Mindanao, Zamboanga Peninsula, BARMM, and Davao Region.
- Monday (16 September): MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, Caraga Region, Northern Mindanao, Zamboanga Peninsula, and Davao Region.

## **HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS**

### **24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook**

- Moderate to rough seas over the following coastal waters:
  - 1.5 to 4.0 m: The western seaboard of Palawan and Occidental Mindoro.
  - 1.5 to 3.5 m: the western seaboard of Western Visayas, the western and southern seaboard of Negros Island Region, the southern seaboard of Central Visayas, the southern seaboard of Eastern Visayas, the seaboard of Caraga Region, the seaboard of Northern Mindanao, the northern and western seaboard of Zamboanga Peninsula, the eastern seaboard of Davao Region, and the remaining seaboard of Palawan.
- 1.0 to 3.0 m: The eastern seaboard of Eastern Visayas
- 1.0 to 2.5 m: The northern seaboard of Ilocos Region, the northern seaboard of Cagayan Valley, the southern seaboard of Quezon, the seaboard of Bicol Region, and the remaining seaboard of MIMAROPA, Visayas, Davao Region, and Zamboanga Peninsula.
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.
- Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:
  - Up to 2.0 m: The remaining seaboard of the country.
- Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

### **TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK**

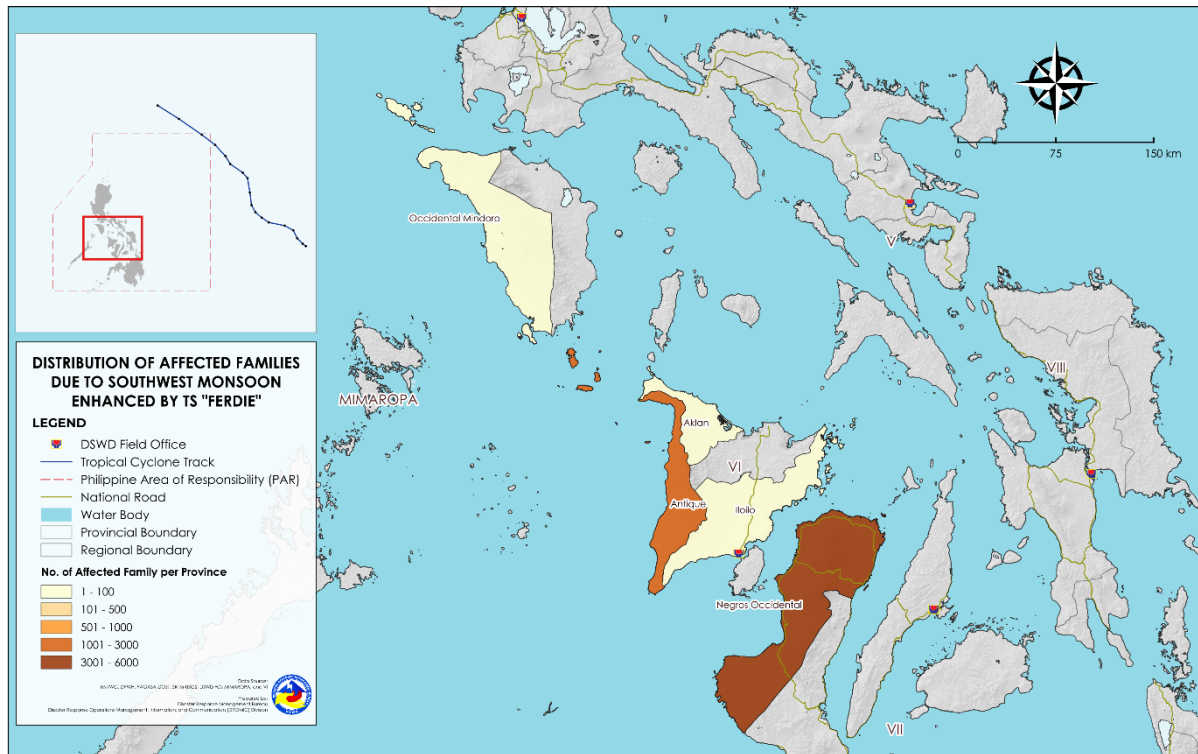
- Outside PAR, FERDIE is forecast to move generally northwestward towards Okinawa, Japan then west northwestward over the East China Sea.
- FERDIE is forecast to re-intensify into a severe tropical storm today and the possibility of reaching typhoon category over the East China Sea is not ruled out.

The center of the eye was estimated based on all available data 1,210 km East Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR) (25.5 °N, 132.5 °E) while Moving West Northwestward at 20 km/h with a maximum sustained winds of 85 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 105 km/h.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **8,371 families** or **25,553 persons** are affected in **127 barangays** in **Regions VI** and **MIMAROPA** (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **1,391 families** or **4,422 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **102 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI** and **MIMAROPA** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **480 families** or **1,601 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **1,871 families** or **6,023 persons** displaced in **Regions VI** and **MIMAROPA** (see Annex D).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **nine (9) houses** were damaged; of which, **three (3)** are **totally damaged** and **six (6)** are **partially damaged** in **Region VI** (see Annex E).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱ 917,607.68** worth of assistance from **DSWD** was provided to the affected families (see Annex F).
