

## DSWD DROMIC Report #23 on the Effects of Severe Tropical Storm “Enteng” and Southwest Monsoon

as of 12 September 2024, 6PM


### I. Situation Overview

On 04 September 2024, “Enteng” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **806,265 families** or **3,047,049 persons** are affected in **2,923 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **2,905 families** or **10,803 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **149 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, V, and CAR** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **19,544 families** or **52,772 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **22,449 families** or **63,575 persons** still displaced in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, V, VII, and CAR** (see Annex F).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **6,510 houses** were damaged; of which, **117** are **totally damaged** and **6,393** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex G).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱331,686,470.49** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱314,516,094.38** from **DSWD**, **₱16,310,357.11** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱634,691.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱225,328.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex H).
