

# DSWD DROMIC Report #27 on the Effects of Severe Tropical Storm “Enteng” and Southwest Monsoon as of 14 September 2024, 6PM

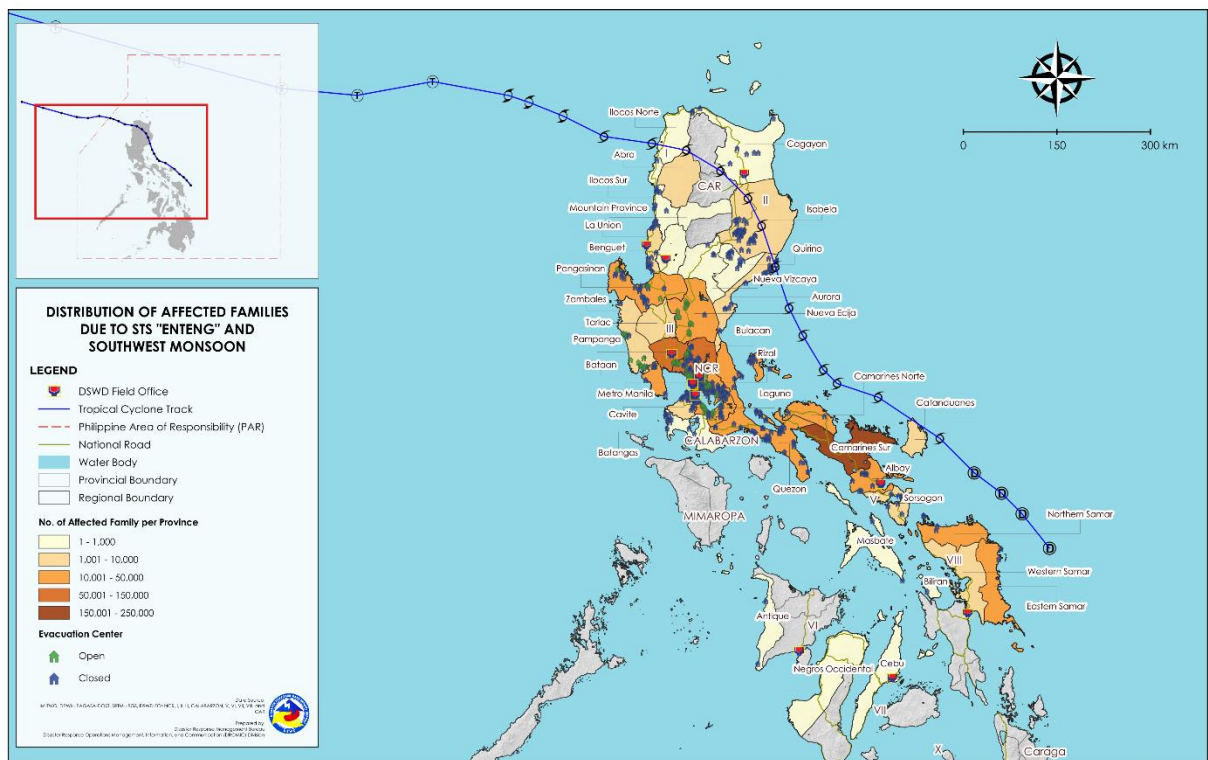
## I. Situation Overview

On 04 September 2024, “Enteng” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **824,415 families** or **3,123,675 persons** are affected in **2,982 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **1,832 families** or **6,790 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **98 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, V, and CAR** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **16,828 families** or **45,036 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **18,648 families** or **51,782 persons** still displaced in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, V, VII, and CAR** (see Annex F).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **6,516 houses** were damaged; of which, **120** are **totally damaged** and **6,396** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex G).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱381,267,304.71** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱363,867,549.65** from **DSWD**, **₱16,532,636.06** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱641,791.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱225,328.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex H).
