
I. Situation Overview

On 14 September 2024, "Ferdie" exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 32,625 families or 130,174 persons are affected in 253 barangays in Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX and XII (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 3,249 families or 12,471 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 102 evacuation centers in MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX and XII (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **522 families** or **1,801 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are 3,771 families or 14,272 persons displaced in Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX and XII (see Annex F).







IV. Damaged Houses

A total of 100 houses were damaged; of which, 13 are totally damaged and 87 are partially damaged in Regions VI and IX (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P1,343,207.82** worth of assistance from **DSWD** was provided to the affected families (see Annex H).

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 150,398 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 69,250 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 81,148 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 631,272 FFPs available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, V. VI, VII, IX and XII.
- 948,915 FFPs in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm "Ferdie".
