

DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm “Ferdie” as of 14 September 2024, 6PM

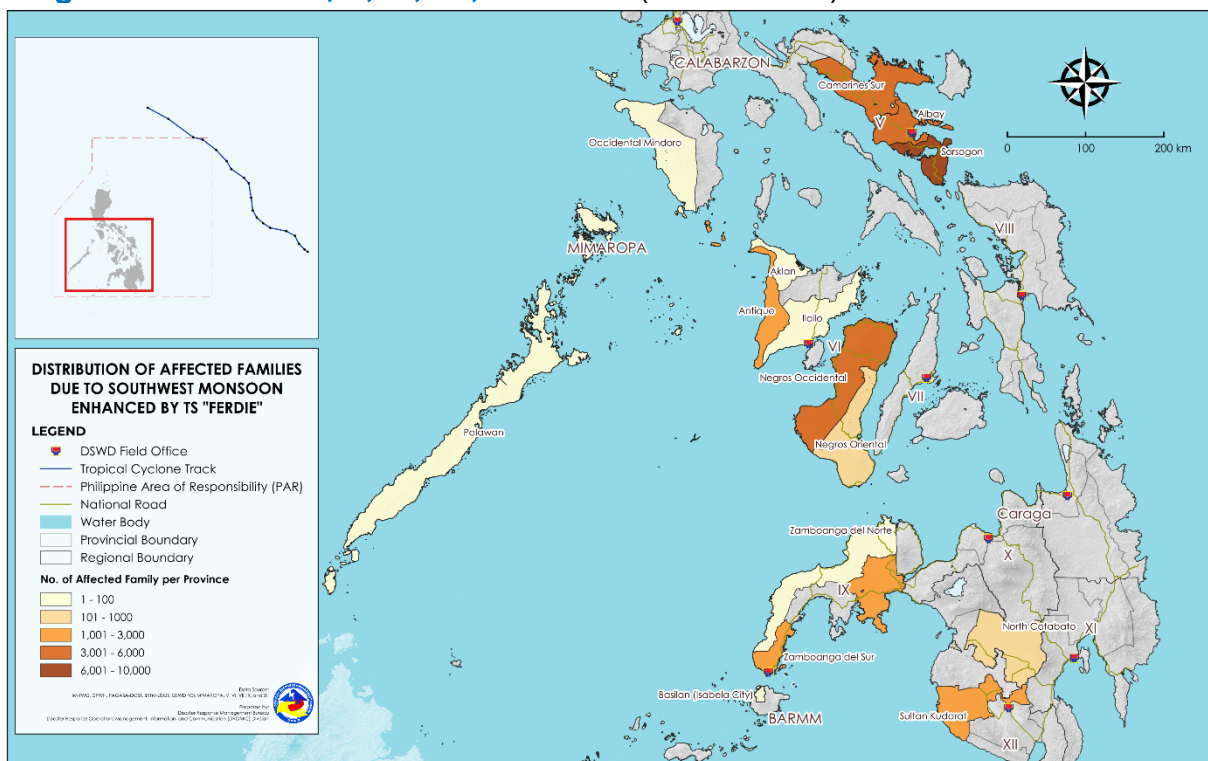
I. Situation Overview

On 14 September 2024, “Ferdie” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **32,625 families** or **130,174 persons** are affected in **253 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX and XII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **3,249 families** or **12,471 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **102 evacuation centers** in **MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX and XII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **522 families** or **1,801 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **3,771 families** or **14,272 persons** displaced in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX and XII** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **100 houses** were damaged; of which, **13** are **totally damaged** and **87** are **partially damaged** in **Regions VI** and **IX** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱1,343,207.82** worth of assistance from **DSWD** was provided to the affected families (see Annex H).
