

# DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm “Ferdie” as of 15 September 2024, 6AM

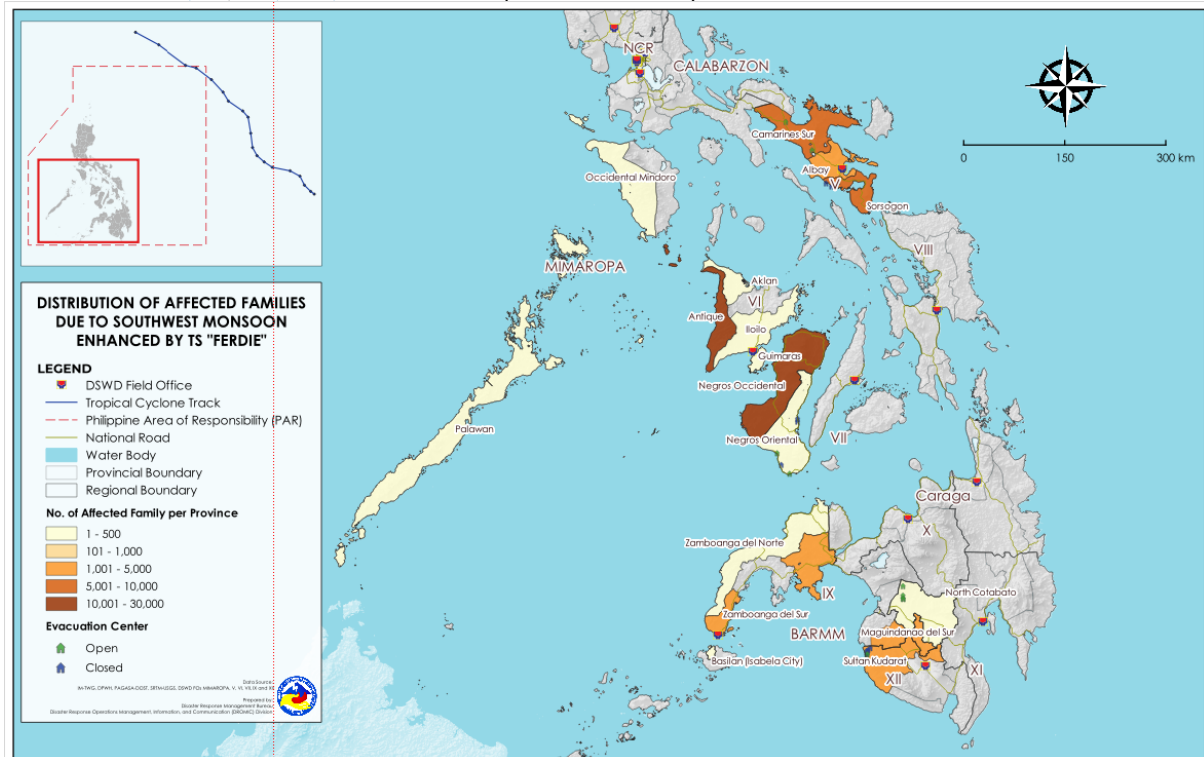
## I. Situation Overview

On 14 September 2024, Tropical Storm “Ferdie” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **72,258 families** or **262,163** are affected in **538 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX and XII** (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **7,755 families** or **27,158 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **308 evacuation centers** in **MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX and XII** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **2,366 families** or **7,196 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **10,121 families** or **34,354 persons** displaced in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX and XII** (see Annex F).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **190 houses** were damaged; of which, **21** are **totally damaged** and **169** are **partially damaged** in **Regions VI, VIII** and **IX** (see Annex G).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱ 6,694,080.94** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱ 6,448,890.94** from **DSWD** and **₱ 245,190.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex H).
