

# DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Severe Tropical Storm “Enteng” and Southwest Monsoon as of 03 September 2024, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

Issued at 05:00 pm, 03 September 2024, “Enteng” intensifies into a severe tropical storm.

### HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

#### Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Forecast accumulated rainfall: Today to tomorrow (4 September) afternoon

- 50-100 mm: Ilocos Region and Abra

Forecast rainfall are generally higher in

elevated or mountainous areas. Under these conditions, flooding and rain-induced landslides are expected especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards as identified in official hazard maps and in localities that experienced considerable amounts of rainfall for the past several days.

Furthermore, the enhanced Southwest Monsoon will bring moderate to intense rainfall in other areas of Luzon (especially along the western portions) over the next three days. For more information, refer to Weather Advisory No. 7 issued at 11:00 AM today.

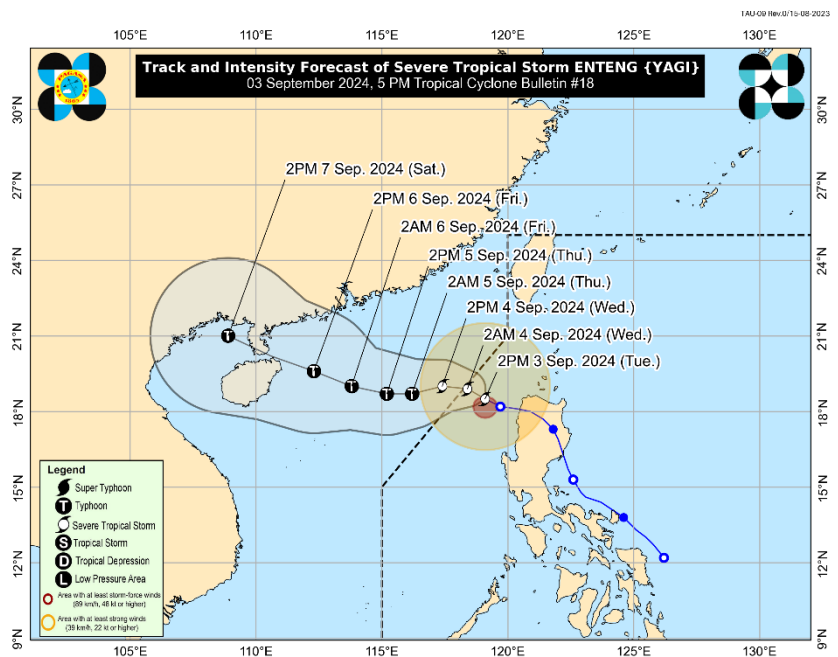
#### Severe Winds

The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

- Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.

The enhanced Southwest Monsoon will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- Today (3 September): Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, Zambales, Bataan, Aurora, Bulacan, Metro Manila,



CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Negros Island, and Northern Samar.

- Tomorrow (4 September): Ilocos Region, Abra, Benguet, Zambales, Bataan, Aurora, Bulacan, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Negros Island, and Northern Samar.
- Thursday (5 September): Ilocos Region, Zambales, Bataan, Aurora, Bulacan, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Negros Island, and Northern Samar.

## HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

In the next 24 hours, ENTENG and the enhanced Southwest Monsoon will bring the following conditions over the coastal waters of the country:

- Gale Warning is in effect over the northern and western seaboard of Northern Luzon. Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas. For more information, refer to Gale Warning No. 6 issued at 5:00 PM today.
- Moderate to rough seas are expected over the remaining seaboard of Northern Luzon outside Gale Warning areas (1.5 to 3.5 m) and the western seaboard of Central and Southern Luzon (1.5 to 4.0 m). Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.
- Up to moderate seas are expected over the eastern seaboard of Central and Southern Luzon, the southern seaboard of Southern Luzon (1.0 to 2.5 m), the western and eastern seaboard of Visayas, and the eastern seaboard of Mindanao (1.0 to 2.0 m). Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

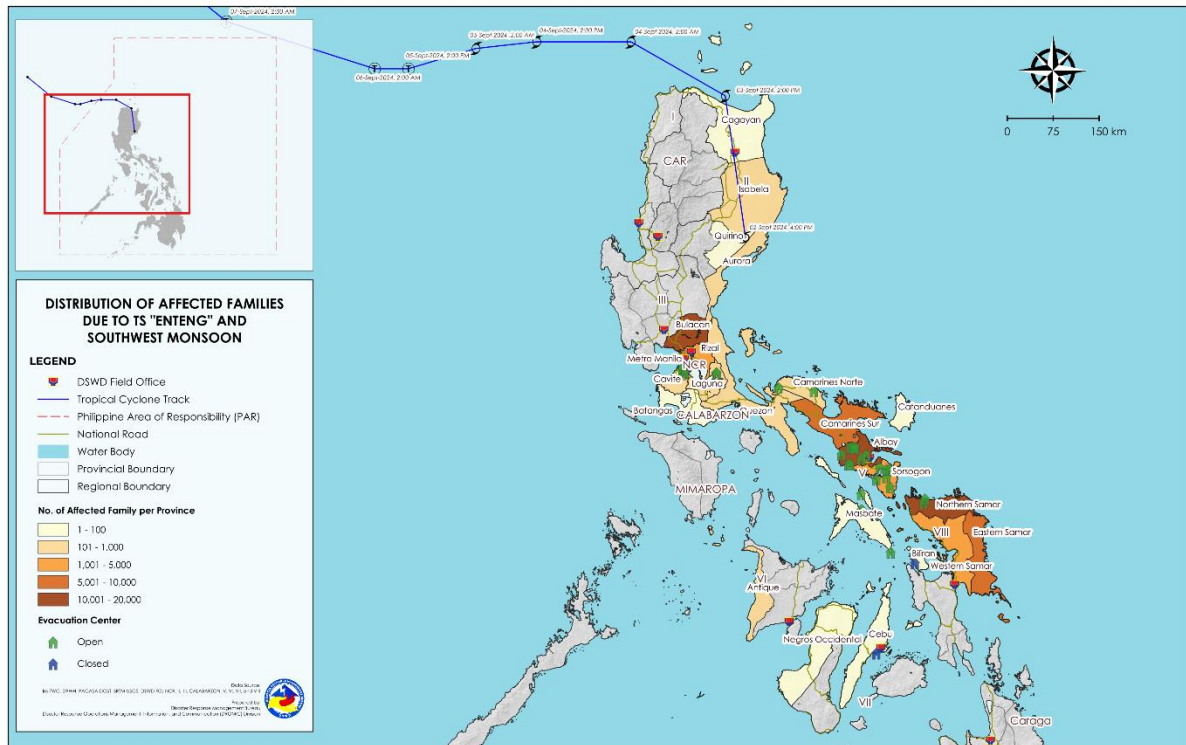
## TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- On the track forecast, ENTENG will exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) tomorrow morning. Outside the PAR region, the tropical storm will move generally westward until Friday morning, then turn west northwestward for the remainder of the forecast period. ENTENG is forecast to make another landfall in the vicinity of southern mainland China during the weekend.
- ENTENG is forecast to intensify throughout the forecast period and may become a typhoon on Thursday. The tropical cyclone may also reach its peak intensity by late Friday or early Saturday prior to making landfall in mainland China.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **188,516 families** or **697,212 persons** are affected in **1,068 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR** (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **16,966 families** or **69,815 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **475 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VIII** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **5,329 families** or **17,147 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **22,295 families** or **86,962 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex E).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **613 houses** were damaged; of which, **57** are **totally damaged** and **556** are **partially damaged** in **Region I, III, V, VI, VII, VIII** (see Annex F).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱27,679,840.48** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱26,529,239.34** from **DSWD** and **₱1,150,601.14** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex G).
