

## DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm “Ferdie” as of 15 September 2024, 6PM

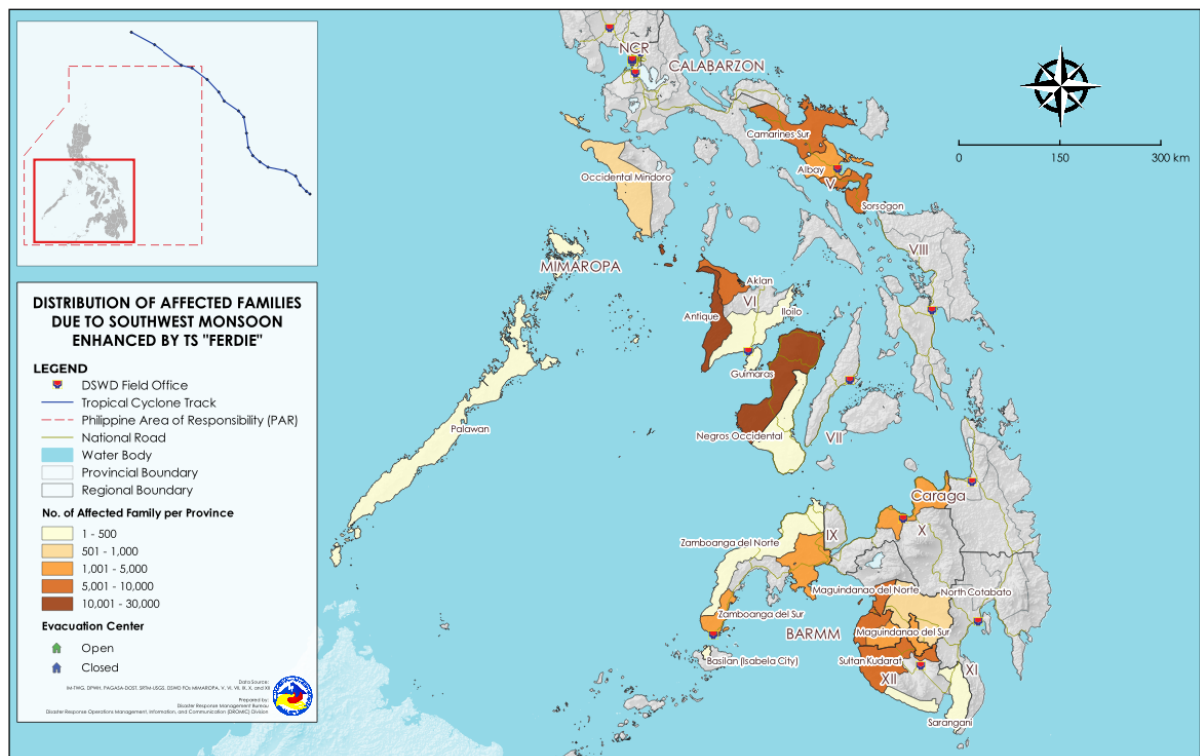
### I. Situation Overview

On 14 September 2024, Tropical Storm “Ferdie” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **85,582 families** or **328,893** are affected in **682 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, X, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **9,673 families** or **33,416 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **376 evacuation centers** in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **3,272 families** or **10,984 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **12,945 families** or **44,400 persons** displaced in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, XII,** and **BARMM** (see Annex F).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **466 houses** were damaged; of which, **99** are **totally damaged** and **367** are **partially damaged** in **Regions VI, VII, IX, X, XII,** and **BARMM** (see Annex G).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱8,810,554.36** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱8,555,364.36** from **DSWD** and **₱255,190.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex H).
