

DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm “Ferdie” as of 16 September 2024, 6AM

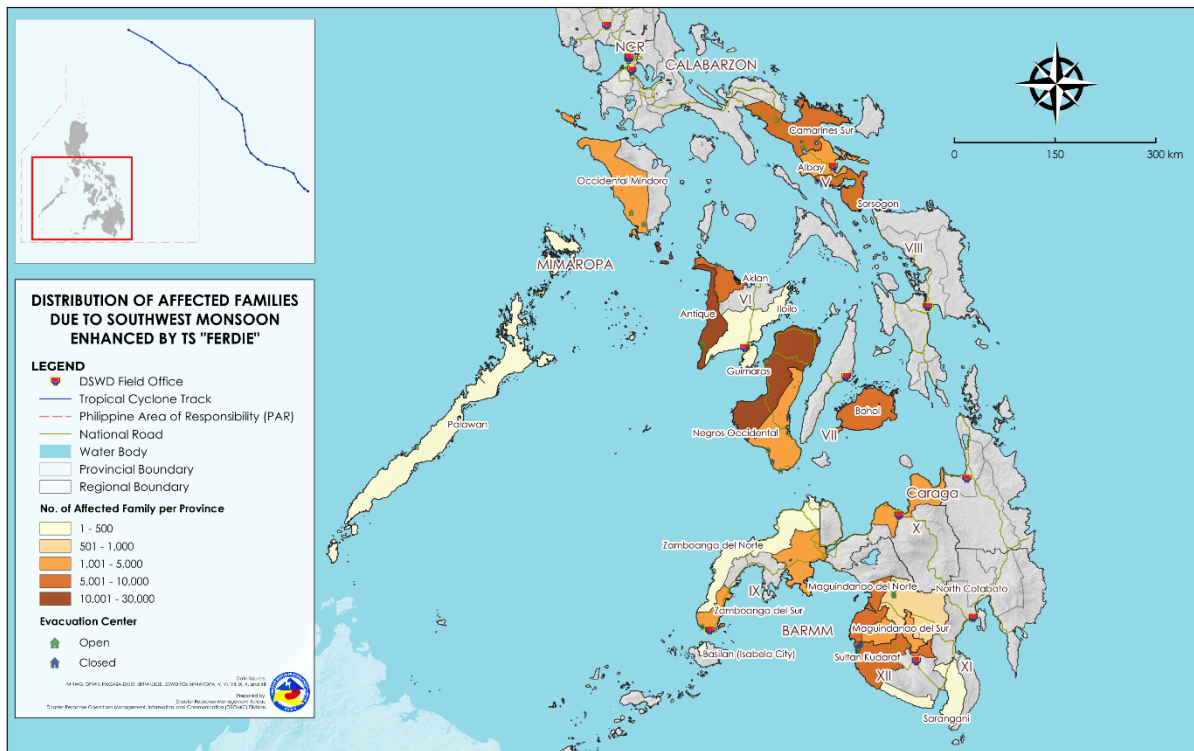
I. Situation Overview

On 14 September 2024, Tropical Storm “Ferdie” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **98,274 families** or **357,906** are affected in **764 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, X, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **10,569 families** or **36,348 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **422 evacuation centers** in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **3,880 families** or **12,888 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **14,449 families** or **49,236 persons** displaced in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **629 houses** were damaged; of which, **133** are **totally damaged** and **496** are **partially damaged** in **Regions VI, VII, IX, X, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱11,141,387.36** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱10,478,802.36** from **DSWD** and **₱662,585.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex H).
