

DSWD DROMIC Report #7 on the Effects of Severe Tropical Storm “Enteng” and Southwest Monsoon as of 04 September 2024, 6PM

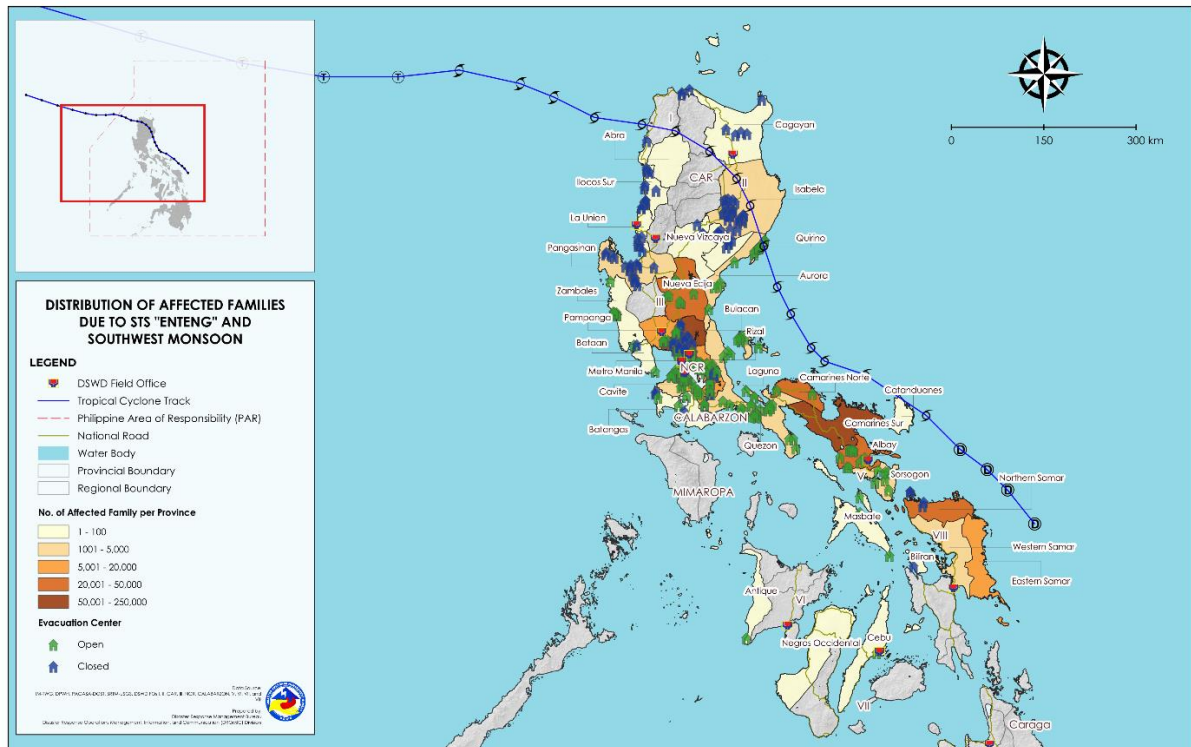
I. Situation Overview

Issued at 5:00 AM, 04 September 2024, “Enteng” slightly intensifies and is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **499,219 families** or **1,935,409 persons** are affected in **1,935 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **17,615 families** or **67,778 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **468 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, V, VI** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **3,394 families** or **13,038 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **21,009 families** or **80,816 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **666 houses** were damaged; of which, **70** are **totally damaged** and **596** are **partially damaged** in **Region I, III, V, VI, VII, VIII** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱83,865,061.57** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱82,081,332.85** from **DSWD**, **₱1,783,228.72** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** and **₱500.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex G).
