

DSWD DROMIC Report #7 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon, Tropical Storm "Ferdie", and Tropical Depression "Gener" as of 16 September 2024, 6PM

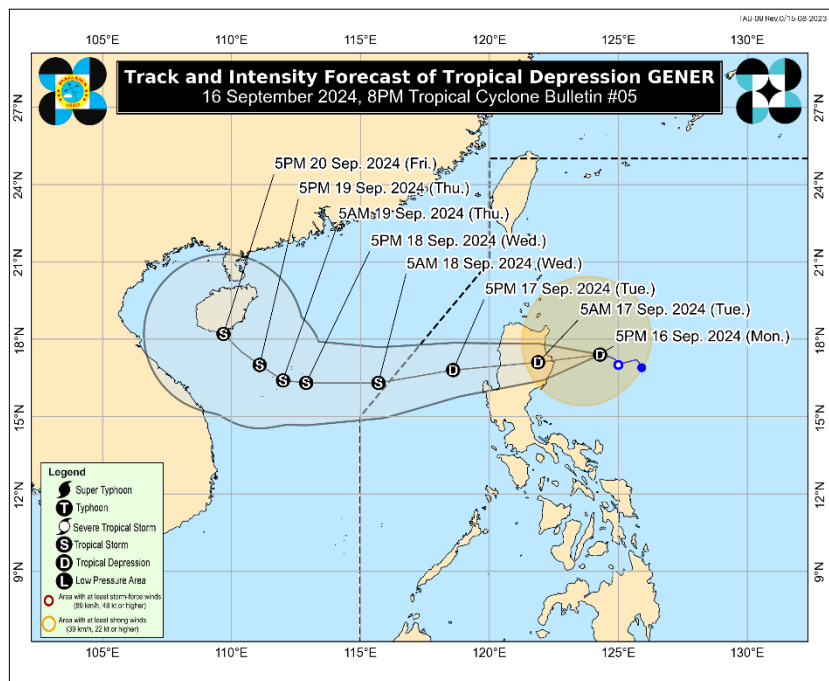
I. Situation Overview

Issued on 16 September 2024 at 5:00 PM, Tropical Depression "Gener" continues to approach Northern Luzon.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Refer to Weather Advisory No. 21 issued at 5:00 PM today for the heavy rainfall outlook due to Tropical Depression "Gener" and the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by "Gener" and Tropical Storm Pulasan.



Severe Winds

The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

- Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.

The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by "Gener" and "Pulasan" will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- Today: Batanes, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, Northern Mindanao, Caraga Region, and Davao Region.
- Tomorrow (17 September): Batanes, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, and Mindanao
- Wednesday (18 September): Zambales, Bataan, Pampanga, Bulacan, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, and Mindanao.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Gale Warning is in effect over several coastal waters in the western and southern seaboard of Southern Luzon, the seaboard of Visayas, and the western, northern, and eastern seaboard of Mindanao. Sea travel in these waters is risky for small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas.

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- 1.5 to 3.5 m: Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and the northern seaboard of Ilocos Region and Cagayan Valley
- 1.5 to 3.0 m: The eastern seaboard of Bicol Region, the seaboard of Visayas outside Gale Warning areas, and the eastern seaboard of Caraga Region and Davao Region.
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 2.5 m: The remaining seaboard of the country outside Gale Warning areas.
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

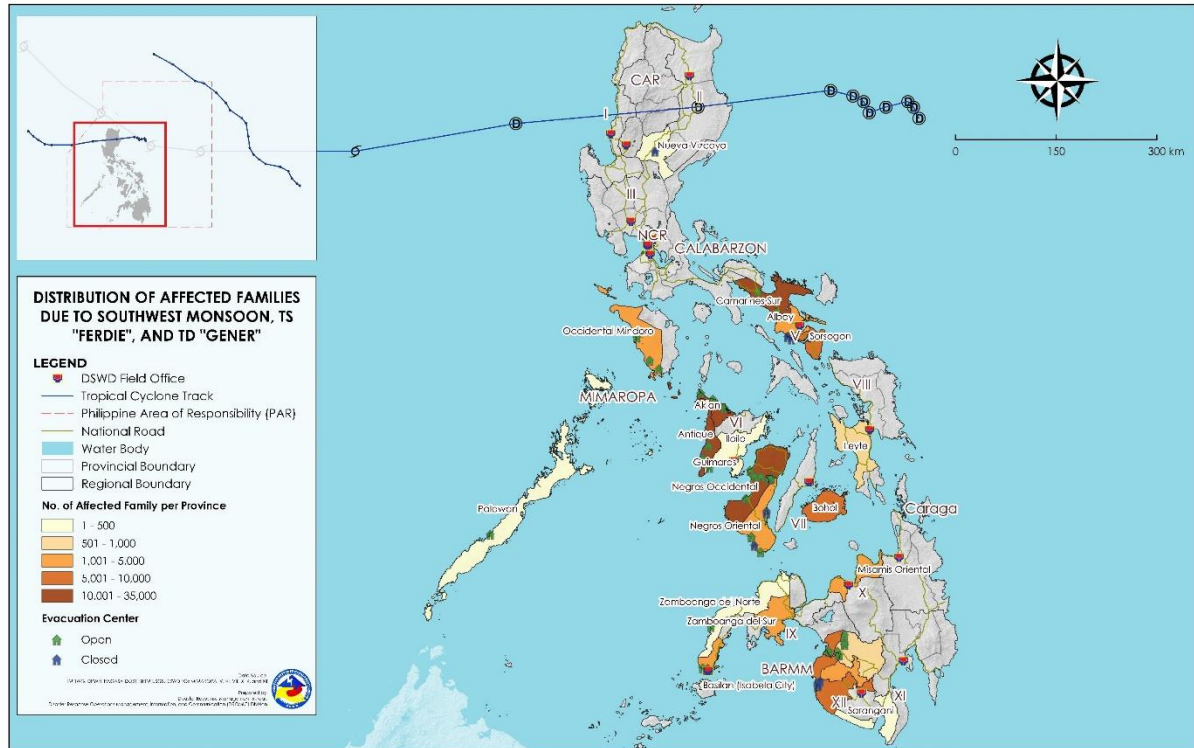
- “Gener” is forecast to make landfall in the vicinity of Isabela or Aurora tonight or tomorrow early morning and may likely emerge over the coastal waters of La Union or Pangasinan tomorrow (17 September) late morning or noon. The tropical cyclone will then move generally westward over the West Philippine Sea until Wednesday (18 September) before turning northwestward on Thursday (19 September) as it heads towards southern mainland China.
- “Gener” may exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) between tomorrow late evening and Wednesday morning.
- “Gener” will likely cross the landmass of mainland Luzon as a tropical depression, although the possibility of reaching tropical storm category or slight weakening prior to landfall is not ruled out. Over the West Philippine Sea, “Gener” may reach tropical storm category tomorrow evening or on Wednesday morning.

The center of the eye was estimated based on all available data at 290 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.4°N, 124.5°E) moving Northwestward at 10 km/h with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70km/h and central pressure of 996hPa.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **133,632 families** or **505,811** are affected in **924 barangays** in **Regions II, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **13,990 families** or **52,827 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **493 evacuation centers** in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **7,008 families** or **27,419 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **20,998 families** or **80,246 persons** displaced in **Regions II, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **751 houses** were damaged; of which, **148** are **totally damaged** and **603** are **partially damaged** in **Regions V, VI, VII, IX, X, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱14,647,011.76** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱13,404,196.76** from **DSWD** and **₱1,242,815.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex H).
