

DSWD DROMIC Report #8 on the Effects of Severe Tropical Storm “Enteng” and Southwest Monsoon as of 05 September 2024, 6AM

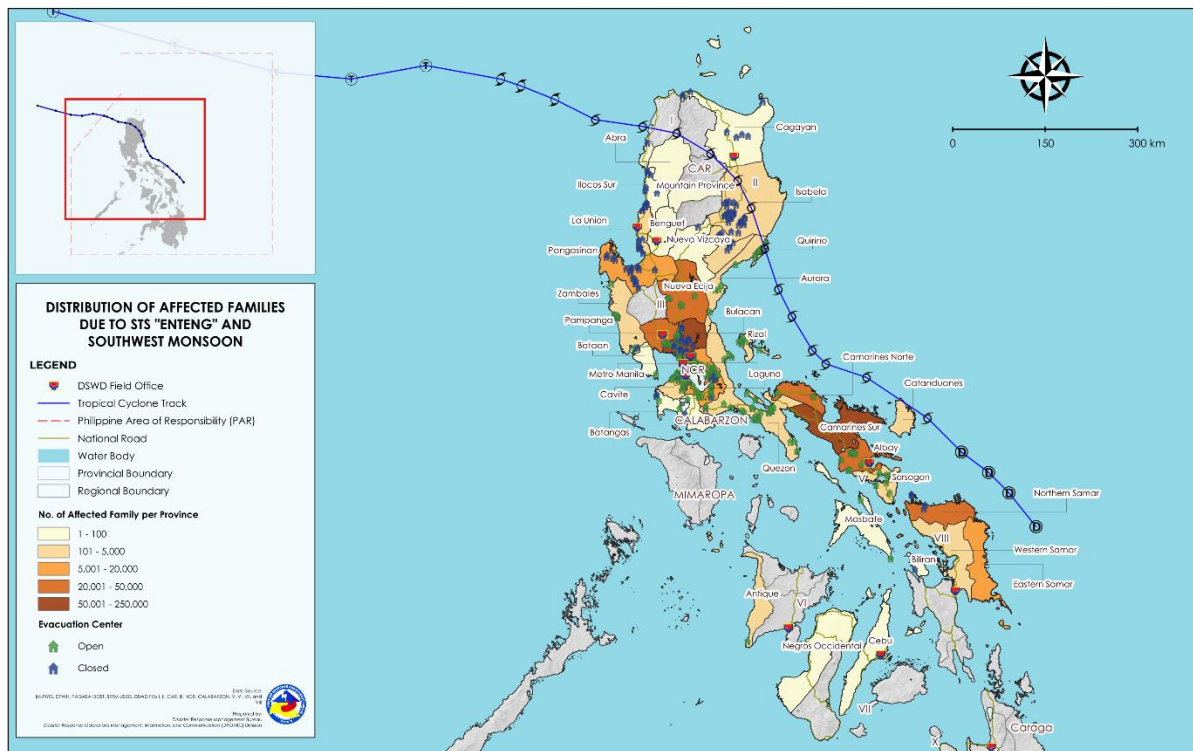
I. Situation Overview

Issued at 5:00 AM, 04 September 2024, “Enteng” slightly intensifies and is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **574,915 families** or **2,195,718 persons** are affected in **2,149 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **10,990 families** or **41,354 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **386 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, III, CALABARZON, V** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **3,203 families** or **12,525 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **14,193 families** or **53,879 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, and CAR** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **786 houses** were damaged; of which, **82** are **totally damaged** and **704** are **partially damaged** in **Region I, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱104,489,541.79** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱102,597,653.07** from **DSWD**, **₱1,886,268.72** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** and **₱5,620.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex G).
