

## DSWD DROMIC Report #8 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon, Tropical Storm "Ferdie", and Tropical Depression "Gener"

as of 17 September 2024, 6AM


### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 17 September 2024 at 5:00 AM, Tropical Depression “Gener” maintains its strength while moving westward over Northern Luzon.

#### HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

##### Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Forecast accumulated rainfall: Refer to Weather Advisory No. 25 issued at 5:00 AM today for the heavy rainfall outlook due to Tropical Depression “Gener” and the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by “Gener” and Tropical Storm Pulasan.



##### Severe Winds

The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

- Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.

The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by “Gener” and “Pulasan” will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- Today: Batanes, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, and Mindanao
- Tomorrow (18 September): Zambales, Bataan, Pampanga, Bulacan, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, and Mindanao
- Thursday (19 September): Isabela, Aurora, Pangasinan, Zambales, Bataan, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, and Caraga

## HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

In the next 24 hours, "Gener" and the enhanced Southwest Monsoon will bring the following conditions over the coastal waters of the country:

- Gale Warning is in effect over several coastal waters in the northern seaboard of Northern Luzon, the western and southern seabards of Southern Luzon, the seabards of Visayas, and the western, northern, and eastern seabards of Mindanao. Sea travel in these waters is risky for small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas.
- Up to rough seas over the Bicol Region (1.5 to 3.0 m), The eastern seabard of Bicol Region, the seabard of Visayas outside Gale Warning areas, and the eastern seabards of Caraga Region and Davao Region. Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.
- Up to moderate seas over the remaining seabards of the country outside Gale Warning areas (up to 2.5 m). Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions.

## TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK


- "Gener" is s forecast to emerge over the coastal waters of Ilocos Sur or La Union today. The tropical cyclone will then move generally westward over the West Philippine Sea until Thursday (19 September) before turning west northwestward as it heads towards southern China.
- "Gener" may exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) between tonight and tomorrow morning.
- "Gener" will likely cross the landmass of mainland Luzon as a tropical depression. Slight weakening is also possible as it interacts with the mountainous terrain of Northern Luzon. Over the West Philippine Sea, GENER may reach tropical storm category tonight or tomorrow early morning, and further intensification is not ruled out.

The center of Tropical Depression "Gener" was estimated based on all available data in the vicinity of Alicia, Isabela (16.8 °N, 121.6 °E) moving Westward at 30 km/h with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **140,148 families** or **531,378** are affected in **1,031 barangays** in **Regions II, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **16,089 families** or **58,541 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **536 evacuation centers** in **Regions II, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **8,775 families** or **35,498 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **24,864 families** or **94,039 persons** displaced in **Regions II, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, IX, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex F).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **807 houses** were damaged; of which, **160** are **totally damaged** and **647** are **partially damaged** in **Regions II, V, VI, VII, IX, X, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex G).

### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱20,660,140.44** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱17,404,945.44** from **DSWD** and **₱3,255,195.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex H).
