

# DSWD DROMIC Report #9 on the Effects of Severe Tropical Storm “Enteng” and Southwest Monsoon as of 05 September 2024, 6PM

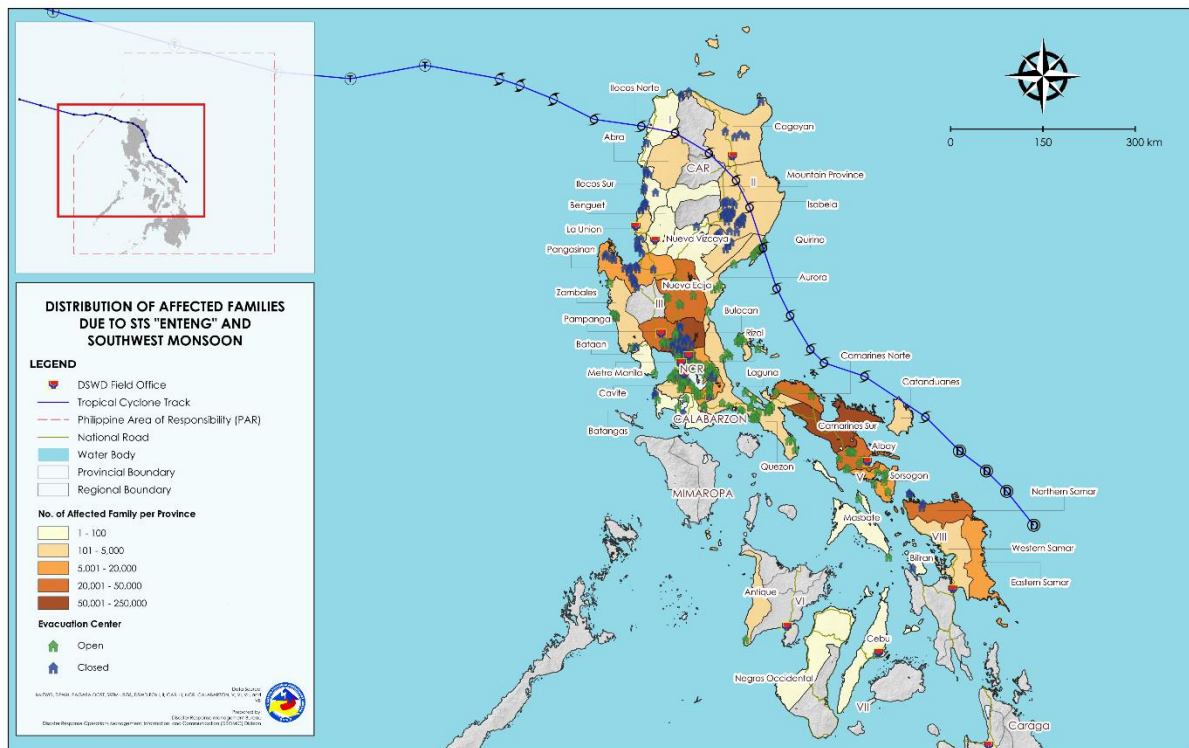
## I. Situation Overview

Issued at 5:00 AM, 04 September 2024, “Enteng” slightly intensifies and is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **582,817 families** or **2,229,338 persons** are affected in **2,200 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR** (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **10,918 families** or **40,895 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **380 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, III, CALABARZON, V** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **3,053 families** or **11,917 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **13,971 families** or **52,812 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, and CAR** (see Annex E).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **5,924 houses** were damaged; of which, **93** are **totally damaged** and **5,831** are **partially damaged** in **Region I, III, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, VIII, CAR** (see Annex F).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱119,470,695.88** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱116,489,814.86** from **DSWD**, **₱2,975,261.02** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** and **₱5,620.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex G).
