

# DSWD DROMIC Terminal Report on the Flash Flood Incident in Tulunan, North Cotabato

29 January 2025, 6AM

## I. Situation Overview

Issued on 09 September 2024 at 6:00 AM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by localized thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms.

On the same day at around at around 8PM, a flash flood incident was experienced in Tulunan, North Cotabato due to localized thunderstorms.
