

# DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in Tantangan, South Cotabato

as of 01 October 2024, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

Issued on 26 September 2024 at 4AM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by ITCZ may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Visayas and Mindanao.

On the same day at around 3PM, several barangays in the municipality of Tantangan, South Cotabato experienced flash floods and strong winds due to the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ).
