



# **DSWD DROMIC Report #10 on Super Typhoon "Julian"**

as of 04 October 2024, 6AM


### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 04 October 2024 at 5AM, "Julian" further weakens into a Tropical Depression.

#### HAZARD AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

Moderate or rough seas over the following coastal waters:

 Up to 3.5 m over the seaboards of Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and Ilocos Norte



- Up to 2.0 m over the remaining seaboards of Ilocos Region and the seaboard of Zambales
- Up to 2.5 m over the northern seaboard of mainland Cagayan, the seaboard of Bataan, the western seaboard of Lubang Island, the western seaboard of Calamian Islands, the western seaboard of northern mainland Palawan, and the seaboard of Kalayaan Islands

Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels

#### TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

• "Julian" is forecast to weaken into a remnant low today over the landmass of Taiwan or the sea southwest of Taiwan.


The center of the eye was estimated based on all available data 240 km North Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (22.6 °N, 120.6 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 55 km/h and is almost stationary.





### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **69,292 families** or **242,983 persons** are affected in **828 barangays** in **Regions I, II,** and **CAR** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **29 families** or **98 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **seven (7) evacuation centers** in **Regions I, II**, and **CAR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **113 families** or **459 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population There are 142 families or 557 persons displaced in Regions I, II, and CAR (see Annex F).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **2,287 houses** were damaged; of which, **127** are **totally damaged** and **2,160** are **partially damaged** in **Region I**, **II**, and **CAR** (see Annex G).

### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱31,682,322.08 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱20,447,764.21 from DSWD, ₱8,231,884.60 from the Local Government





Units (LGUs), ₱2,960,933.27 from Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs), and ₱41,740.00 from other Partners (see Annex H).
