

# DSWD DROMIC Report #11 on Super Typhoon “Julian” as of 04 October 2024, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

Issued on 04 October 2024 at 11AM, “Julian” weakens into a Low Pressure Area (LPA) and is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

### HAZARD AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

#### 24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Moderate or rough seas over the following coastal waters:

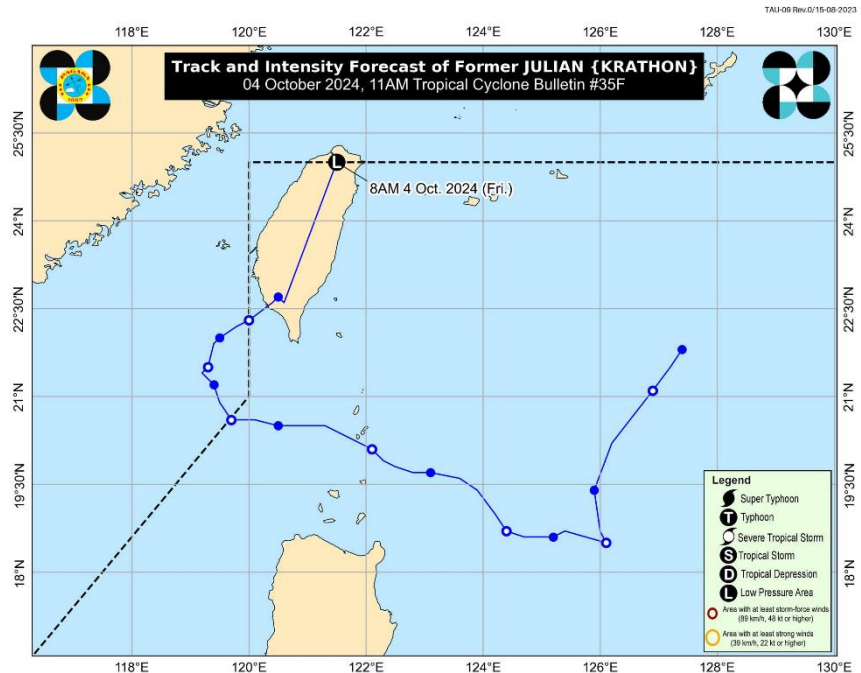
- Up to 3.0 m over the seaboards of Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and Ilocos Norte
- Up to 2.5 m over the remaining seaboards of Ilocos Region and the seaboard of Zambales
- Up to 2.0 m over the northern seaboard of mainland Cagayan, the seaboard of Bataan, the western seaboard of Lubang Island, the western seaboard of Calamian Islands, the western seaboard of northern mainland Palawan, and the seaboard of Kalayaan Islands

Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels

### TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- “Julian” weakened into a remnant low at 8:00 AM today. The remnant circulation of “Julian” is forecast to merge with the frontal system over Taiwan area.

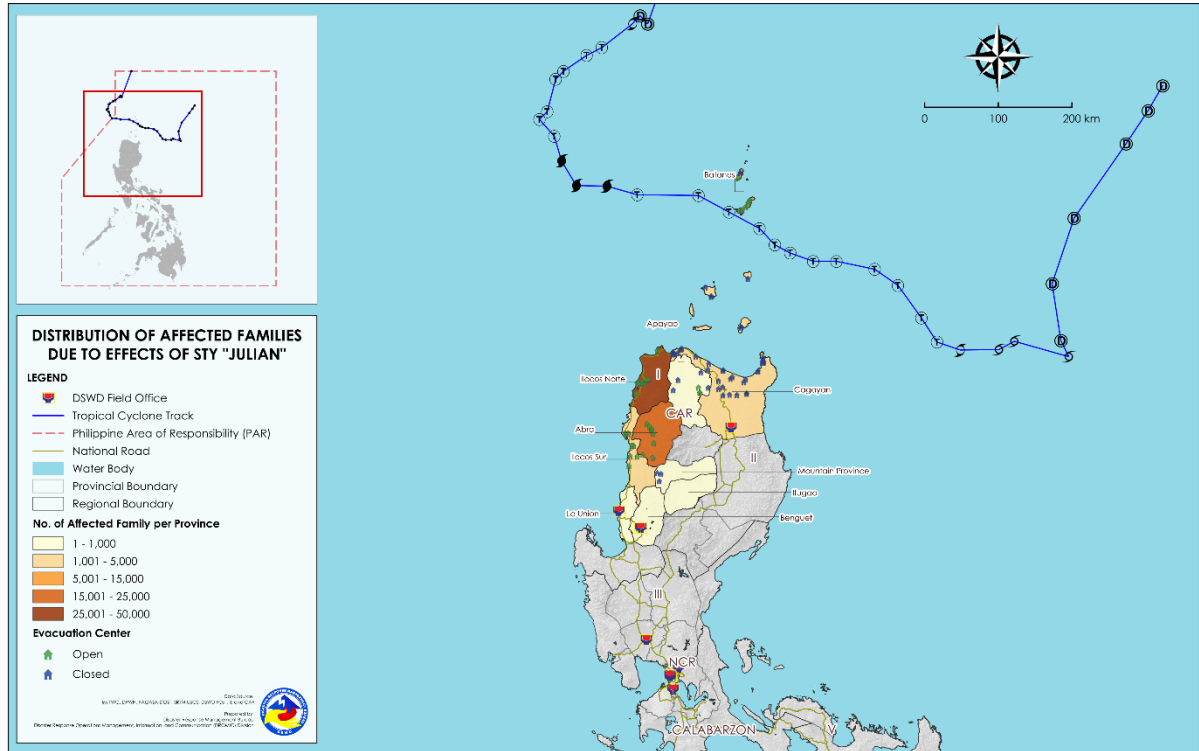
The Low Pressure Area was estimated based on all available data at 480 km North of Itbayat, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (25.1 °N, 121.6 °E) and is moving Northward at 45km/h.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **79,063 families** or **277,669 persons** are affected in **868 barangays** in **Regions I, II, and CAR** (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **21 families** or **72 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **six (6) evacuation centers** in **Regions II and CAR** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **113 families** or **459 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **134 families** or **531 persons** displaced in **Regions II and CAR** (see Annex F).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **2,301 houses** were damaged; of which, **128 are totally damaged** and **2,173 are partially damaged** in **Regions I, II, and CAR** (see Annex G).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱37,225,231.68** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱21,859,213.81** from **DSWD**, **₱12,363,344.60** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱2,960,933.27** from **Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱41,740.00** from **other Partners** (see Annex H).
