
DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in Mindanao as of 29 October 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 17 October 2024 at 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in SOCCSKSARGEN. On the same day at around 6:00 PM, several barangays in the Municipality of Pikit, North Cotabato experienced flash flood incidents due to heavy rains caused by ITCZ.

On 18 October 2024, residents of Sitio Lambusong, Brgy. Puti, South Cotabato underwent preemptive evacuation as persistent heavy rains posed threat of landslide in the area. At around 8:00 PM, some barangays in Glan, Sarangani Province also experienced flash flood incidents due to the heavy rains brought by the ITCZ.

On 19 October 2024, several municipalities in Maguindanao del Sur also experienced flooding due to the continuous heavy rainfall brought by the ITCZ.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **41,396 families** or **148,769 persons** are affected in **78 barangays** in **Region XII** and **BARMM** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **108 families** or **395 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **one (1) evacuation center** in **Region XII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **two (2) families** or **10 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **110 families** or **405 persons** still displaced in **Region XII** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **two (2) houses** were **totally damaged** in **Brgy. San Jose, Glan, Sarangani** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱298,339.20** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex G).
