





DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Easterlies

as of 14 October 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 01 October 2024, several barangays in the municipalities of Sta. Cruz, Davao del Sur and Banaybanay, Davao Oriental experienced flooding due to the Easterlies.


On 02 October 2024, the Easterlies caused flooding in various municipalities in the province of Maguindanao del Sur.

On 03 October 2024, flashflood incidents were also experienced in the municipalities of Arakan, North Cotabato and Lambayong, Sultan Kudarat.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **37,416 families** or **164,805 persons** are affected in **85 barangays** in **Regions XI, XII,** and **BARMM** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center
 A total of 26 families or 117 persons sought temporary shelter at the Malibatuan
 Covered Court in Region XII (see Annex B).







b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **26 families** or **65 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **26 families** or **65 persons** still displaced in **Region XII** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of 17 houses were damaged; of which, three (3) are totally damaged and 14 are partially damaged in Region XII (see Annex E)

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}1,390,505.00\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, \$\mathbb{P}1,374,605.00\$ from \$\mathbb{D}SWD\$ and \$\mathbb{P}15,900.00\$ from the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex F).

1. Standby Funds

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 234,118 FFPs available at DSWD FOs XI and XII.
- 1,364,651 million FFPs in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of Easterlies.
- ₱1.18 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FOS warehouses.
