

DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Easterlies as of 14 October 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 01 October 2024, several barangays in the municipalities of Sta. Cruz, Davao del Sur and Banaybanay, Davao Oriental experienced flooding due to the Easterlies.

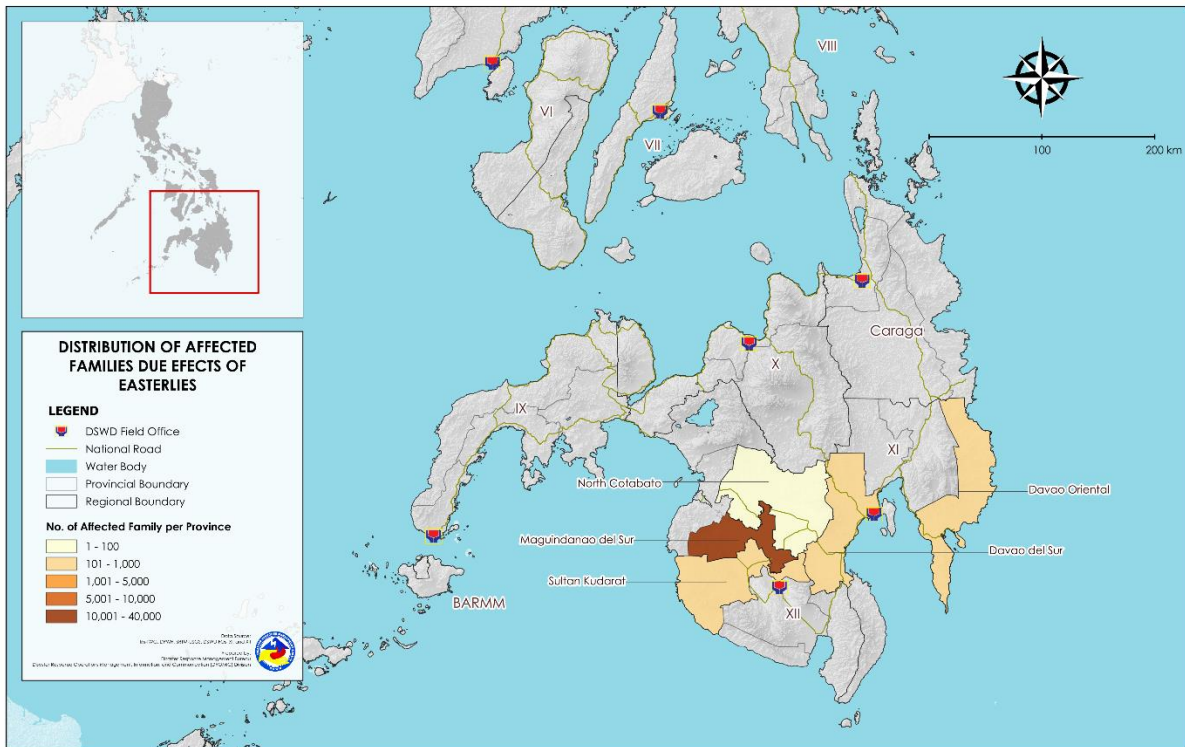
On 02 October 2024, the Easterlies caused flooding in various municipalities in the province of Maguindanao del Sur.

On 03 October 2024, flashflood incidents were also experienced in the municipalities of Arakan, North Cotabato and Lambayong, Sultan Kudarat.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **37,416 families** or **164,805 persons** are affected in **85 barangays** in **Regions XI, XII, and BARMM** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **26 families** or **117 persons** sought temporary shelter at the **Malibatuan Covered Court** in **Region XII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **26 families** or **65 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **26 families** or **65 persons** still displaced in **Region XII** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **17 houses** were damaged; of which, **three (3)** are **totally damaged** and **14** are **partially damaged** in **Region XII** (see Annex E)

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱1,390,505.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱1,374,605.00** from **DSWD** and **₱15,900.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex F).
